We know there is a lot of information to take on board and to consider when making the decision about which university to choose. It's a big decision to make and one which entails much more than looking at what degree courses are on offer.



SCHOLARSHIPS OF UP TO £7,500!

Queen's believes in rewarding hard work and excellence. Every year, we offer a range of fantastic scholarships for new students from England, Scotland, Wales, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man. This includes the opportunity to receive up to £2,500* per year off your fees. Alternatively, you can avail of great lifestyle benefits including free flights, accommodation upgrades, and even free gym and cinema passes!



UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR GB STUDENTS

A generous £2,500 per year (£1,750 plus benefits, see opposite) is available for eligible students** achieving AAB at A-level or the equivalent in other qualifications. Those who achieve ABB at A-level or the equivalent in other qualifications will receive £1,750 per year (£1,000 plus benefits), while students who satisfy the conditions of their offer will qualify for a £1,250 scholarship (£500 plus benefits).

**To be eligible students must make Queen's their firm choice. Scholarships are offered for the full duration of your undergraduate course.

The Titanic Quarter is a sleek urban development that houses Titanic Belfast, the World's Best Visitor Attraction (World Travel Awards 2016), alongside the city's booming tech and film industries.

The cobbled stoned streets and fascinating architecture of the Cathedral Quarter play host to the city's best bars and clubs.

A host of exciting new developments are underway around the city including the Grand Central Hotel in the former Windsor House offices and the George Best Hotel, while Marriott is set to take on the City Quays hotel project.

Whether you're on a pilgrimage to the famous *Game of Thrones* filming locations or you fancy exploring caves, castles and coastline, you'll find it all within an hour's drive of Belfast.

The world is catching on to the secret that locals have always known: Northern Ireland is one of the most beautiful places on the planet. Just ask the experts at Lonely Planet who recently lauded Belfast and the Causeway Coast as the number one region in the world (2017). From golden beaches to lush forests, as a student in Belfast, the region's most breath-taking landscapes will be right on your doorstep.

Spend your downtime testing your nerve crossing the death-defying Carrick-a-Rede rope bridge. Alternatively, scale the heights of our tallest peak, Slieve Donard, set in the picturesque Mourne Mountains – an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and the inspiration for CS Lewis' magical world of Narnia.

You can also follow the 22-mile Mourne Wall, featured in *Game of Thrones*. And if you're a fan of the hit HBO show, you can't afford to miss a trip to the Dark Hedges. This twisting avenue of light and shade is one of Northern Ireland's most photographed natural phenomena, and doubles as the King's Road in the series.

The cultural quarter surrounding our campus is the most vibrant district of Belfast. Here, you'll find everything from hot-ticket cultural events and party nights to international festivals and world cuisine worth queuing for.

A COSMOPOLITAN COMMUNITY

Our friendly and welcoming student community and buzzing entertainment scene offers a ready-made social life from the day you arrive. From classical concerts at the Whitley Hall to legendary club nights, not to mention pub quizzes, poetry readings and comedy nights, Queen's Quarter is bursting with entertainment venues that attract the best from the worlds of theatre, dance, music, film, arts and literature. It's no wonder our venues feature hotly in the calendar of both the Belfast International Arts Festival and the Belfast Film Festival.

AN ART-LOVER'S PARADISE

The University is home to the renowned visual arts platform, the Naughton Gallery, the Seamus Heaney Centre for Poetry and the Brian Friel Centre for Theatre. We even have our own boutique cinema, the QFT (Queen's Film Theatre), presenting the best in classic and new world cinema.



Some of our favourite spots near campus include the Ulster Museum (don't miss their awesome science evenings, where you can experiment over cocktails); the infamously rowdy comedy nights at The Belfast Empire Music Hall, and the Lyric Theatre, where you might just catch a glimpse of current patron and Queen's alumni Liam Neeson. (Pst! The coffee shop alone is worth a visit for the superb panoramic views over the River Lagan).

A MULTICULTURAL AND CREATIVE HUB

There is an incredible range of cafés, bistros and restaurants dotted around the University's bohemian surroundings, catering to all tastes and budgets. In the space of 400 metres along Botanic Avenue, you can sample food from Japan, Korea, Nepal, China, the Middle East, India, Italy, Mexico and, of course, Northern Ireland – all washed down with home-grown craft brews.

You'll also find quirky vintage and pre-loved shopping, and the famed No Alibis indie bookstore, while the Fine & Dandy Sunday market in the Crescent Arts Centre is a creative hub for independent artists, designers, illustrators and crafters.

GREEN SPACES AND URBAN PARKS

A short hop from the bustling streetscape of Botanic Avenue is the lush foliage of Botanic Gardens, a beautiful city park where you can find some headspace in the Palm House or the Tropical Ravine.

In fact, you'll be surprised to find just how accessible natural solitude is from Queen's: the nearby Lagan Towpath offers an unspoilt stretch of riverbank with forest walks and meadows that feel a world away from our bustling campus.

BOARD THE 'STARSHIP FOR SCHOLARS'

Designed by the same architects behind the libraries at Yale and Harvard, its little wonder Nobel laureate Seamus Heaney dubbed the McClay Library a 'starship for our scholars.' Blending the best features of a traditional library with the latest smart technology, you'll have access to extensive book and journal collections, reader spaces, temperature-controlled computer workstations and group study rooms.

NEW STUDENT HUBS

The School of Biological Sciences is spread over five floors and is designed around a central atrium which acts as a social hub, while we're also giving the School of Mathematics and Physics a new home, featuring a dedicated space for teaching, with new lecture and group-study rooms, a student social area, computer facilities and a state-of-the-art Physics laboratory.

The new Wellcome-Wolfson Building (Institute for Experimental Medicine) is located next to the Centre for Cancer Research and Cell Biology (CCRCB) and is designed to enhance its internationally-recognised excellence in education and research.







These grades should be treated as a guide only, as variations can occur in certain circumstances. Prospective students are responsible for checking the most up-to-date course requirements before applying. For full details of our entry requirements for each course, please refer to go.qub.ac.uk/coursefinder

Where alternative A-Level grades are listed in Column 5, specific subject requirements apply for the lower offer OR one of the offers is based on an A* grade OR the requirements differ for some of the degrees, for example, Joint Honours versus Single Honours. It should be noted that some courses require

specific A-level subjects and grades and/or specific GCSE subjects and grades. Please refer to the Course Finder on the University's website, which will have current grade and subject requirements go.qub.ac.uk/coursefinder

Courses marked with a 'P' offer a placement option. Students taking the placement will have an additional year added to their course. Those participating normally receive remuneration.

Column 2 indicates the different weightings assigned to that subject as part of the final degree assessment:

S = Single Honours

M = Major Honours (2/3 weighting)

J = Joint Honours (1/2 weighting)

Column 3 gives the duration of the course. Courses involving the study of a foreign language as a Single, Major or Joint Honours subject require a year to be spent in the appropriate country (or countries, in the case of Joint Honours).

This undergraduate guide is prepared well in advance of the academic year to which it relates. Therefore, the target grades stated here are for guidance only.

HOW AND WHEN TO APPLY

HOW TO APPLY

Applications for admission to full-time undergraduate and sandwich courses at the University should normally be made through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). Full information can be obtained from the UCAS website at: ucas.com/apply.

WHEN TO APPLY

UCAS will start processing applications for entry in autumn 2019 from 1 September 2018.

The advisory closing date for the receipt of applications is 15 January 2019 (18:00), however, for applicants applying to Oxford or Cambridge and for those whose choices include Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary Medicine/Science the closing date is 15 October 2018 (18:00).

Currently there are two intakes for Adult Nursing (one in September and the other in February) and application is made for both courses by 15 January (18:00) prior to the

academic year of entry ie for September and the following February. The application deadline will not change but it should be noted that from 2019-20 entry, the two intakes may be combined. Please refer to the online prospectus which will be updated as further information becomes available.

Applicants are encouraged to apply as early as is consistent with having made a careful and considered choice of institutions and courses. Earlier applicants

normally receive decisions more quickly. Late applications are, in practice, accepted by UCAS throughout the remainder of the application cycle, but you should understand that they are considered by institutions at their discretion, and there can be no guarantee that they will be given the same full level of consideration as applications received by the advisory closing date.

Applications for Nursing, Midwifery and Social Work must be submitted by the 15 January (18:00) deadline. Applications received after this date will not be considered.

Take care to enter the details of the institutions and courses clearly and correctly on the application. For Queen's, the institution code name is QBELF and the institution code is Q75. These should be entered in the Choices section of your UCAS application. Please note a Campus Code is not required.


