The Harvard referencing system is commonly used.

It's known as the author-date system because you must include both the author and the date for in-text citations and then in your reference list or bibliography, you need to provide full bibliographic details for every source.

Do note that there is a difference between British Harvard and American Harvard, so check which one you are expected to use.

For example, if you are going to be listing authors in text, for British Harvard you may use up to two, afterwards you use the Latin phrase 'et al', which means 'and others'. Whereas in American Harvard, you can list the first three authors, then use 'et al'. There's lots of different rules for the bibliography and as per each individual source, so if you click on the PDF below, you will be able to see those in detail.

There are also various different conventions for how you can identify a page number or secondary reference or otherwise. Please refer to the information below.
