QUB Inclusive Employment Scheme

Our "Inclusive Employment Scheme" was launched by the then Minister for Employment and Learning Dr Stephen Farry on 29 May 2014.

The scheme is run in conjunction with NIUSE NI Union of Supported Employment and this year we have placed 9 persons with a disability or long term condition in various schools and directorates throughout Queen's.

This programme is a great opportunity for those who have been unable to get work, or have had to leave work because of a disability, to develop skills and gain valuable work experience.

The scheme has been identified as an example of best practice by the <u>Department for Communities</u> and the <u>Equality Commission for Northern Ireland</u>.

It has involved Queen's staff working closely alongside organisations such as <u>Disability Action</u>, <u>The Cedar Foundation</u> and <u>Ulster Supported Employment Limited</u> (USEL), <u>Action Mental Health</u>, and <u>The Orchardville Society</u>, who provide invaluable help and support both during the offer process, and through the placement itself.
