

## Quick Tour of The McClay Library

### **ROISIN**

As you walk through the entrance of The McClay Library, the student lounge, where you can get drinks and snacks, and the café are on the left.

### **DANIEL**

But you must remember that you can't bring food into the library. Drinks are ok if they have a secure top, to prevent any spilling.

### **ROISIN**

You will need your card in order to access the library. The toilet facilities can be found at the same location on each floor, just beside the lifts.

### **DANIEL**

If you need directions or have any queries, just go to the Borrower Services Desk on the ground floor.

### **ROISIN**

The ground floor stays open during term-time, for those late night study sessions.

As you walk through the Atrium the computer help desk and computer shop are on your left. You can get your study supplies here. On your right are the language centre labs - if you're interested in learning a new language, ask at the Borrowers Service Desk.

### **DANIEL**

There are print and photocopy rooms in the Atrium and Extended Hours Reading Room on the ground floor - and on the first floor, second floor and third floor beside the lift. You can collect any work that you have printed from any printer.

There are different places to study within the McClay Library. Now, what study room was he in again?

There are Group Study Rooms on every floor, as shown on this handy map. They can be booked a day in advance through Queen's Online and are great for group projects or rehearsing presentations. Each room comes with a PC, a plasma screen or projector screen.

Yeah, sorry, I had to find it on the map.

Most of the library is a whisper zone but if you want to work in silence, go to the silent study room on the ground floor or one of the areas around the sides of each floor. These areas also have some of the best views of The Botanic Gardens.
