

MS47 J. N. Hart Collection

About the collection

A small collection of Forrest Reid related material donated to Special Collections in July 2001. John N. Hart (1881[?]-1963) was a lifelong friend of Reid (see correspondence, [MS44/1/55](#)). The bulk of material in this collection dates from after Reid's death in 1947 and relates to the Forrest Reid Memorial exhibition in 1953 and Russell Burlingham's Forrest Reid: a portrait and study (London: Faber and Faber, 1953).

2. n.d. As above, but different angle. This print is without inscription.
 The statue depicted is by Margaret Wrightson, and is presumably the original lead statue as reported by the Times on 4th June 1930. The original statue was removed during World War 2 and replaced by a replica. J.N. Hart and Edmund Blunden were both involved in the Elian Society’s appeal to have a bust of Lamb erected in London. The bust was unveiled in November 1935 at Christ Church, Greyfriars. Presumably the Wrightson statue (of a naked boy) was of interest to both J.N. Hart through his Elian Society and Reid because of its subject matter.
