MS 39 McNeill Correspondence

About the collection:

A collection of 163 letters written by Mary Alice McNeill (1897–1984) to her sister Margaret Fink (Peg/Peggy), who resided in various parts of Holland and Germany and was involved in relief work before relocating to England following the loss of her husband. In the series of letters, personal in nature, dating between 1938 to 1978, McNeill discusses a broad spectrum of topics, including politics, her research and beliefs, family matters, and her philanthropic and welfare activities.

Mary (Molly) Alice McNeill was born on August 21, 1897, in Belfast, and attended Richmond Lodge School before enrolling at St Hugh's College, Oxford, and later Alexandra College in Dublin.

When McNeill returned to Belfast in the mid-1920s, she helped to establish The Arellian Nursery (1928) for children from poor families through her work with the Arellian Association.

She served as Secretary for the Irish Christian Fellowship, which created the "Good Neighbors" syllabus for religious studies for teachers in Northern Irish schools in 1937. From 1938 to 1953, she served as Honorary Secretary of the Northern Committee of the Irish Association for Cultural, Economic, and Social Relations. During the Second World War, McNeill was given the opportunity by the Women's Voluntary Services to become District Organizer for the County Borough of Belfast in June 1941, eventually rising to Second Vice Chairman of the Northern Ireland Branch. As Secretary to the Committee of the Nursery School Association of Ireland, McNeill was successfully nominated as a Children's Guardian in 1943, allowing her to attend the Juvenile Court and eventually became one of the first members of the Child Welfare Council.

She was on the Eastern Special Care Service's Board of Management and worked with the Ulster Folk Life Society's committee to establish an open-air folk museum in Belfast (now the Ulster Folk and Transport Museum).

From 1945 to 1964, McNeill served on the board of the Belfast Charitable Society. Working as an independent scholar, she published her first historical biography *The Life and Times of Mary Ann McCracken: A Belfast Panorama* in October 1960.

After declining an M.B.E. in 1953, McNeill accepted an Honorary M.A. (awarded in recognition of her research) from Queen's University Belfast in 1961.

McNeill resigned from the Board of the Belfast Charitable Society in October 1964. The minutes describe her resignation as "a real blow to the Society, in the work of which and its history, Ms McNeill had taken an intense interest".

In addition to her intellectual work, she published two further biographies, Little Tom Drennan (1962) and Vere Foster (1971).

Manuscript, 6 pp., marking left hand corner from staple. Discusses teaching, unemployment in Belfast, and politics. Mentions International Historical Society and Northern Ireland's lack of representation. Mentions dilemma on Eden and Chamberlain and expresses fear for Austrian Jews. References Percy W. Bartlett of Fellowship of Reconciliation (Gen. Sec. 1938-1956), LNU (League of Nations Union), and Austrian Red Cross.

Manuscript, 6 pp., marking left hand corner from staple. Discusses family situation. Mentions meeting John J. Horgan, General Montgomery, and Donal O'Sullivan at the Hibernian Hotel re Irish Association. Considers starting an Irish Association journal with Horgan as editor, and opening branches in both Belfast and Dublin.

Considers Protestants in Ireland.

Accounts previous and current books she has been reading. Discusses event in Dublin with David Gray (American Minister) and issues with conscription in Ireland/Northern Ireland.

Manuscript, 7 pp. Mentions W.V.S, and being nominated as a member of the Rural Development Board of NI.

Manuscript, 4 pp. First page missing, date unknown. Page edges frayed, slight tears, writing unaffected. Discusses Rest Centres, Civil Defence Service/Office, and lack of vision in NI government. Mentions Churchill, and the W.V.S.

Letter, Mount Charles, Belfast, McNeill to 'Peg'.

Manuscript, 6 pp. Mentions "When We Build Again": Cadbury's housing reform and Belfast planning post-Blitz. Considers publishing I.A. pamphlet with O'Sullivan and Haggard on re-construction in Ireland. States a crisis in W.V.S.

Manuscript, 6 pp. Offers thoughts on C. S. Lewis's *The Problem of Pain* (1940) and reflects on her work during the war with the W. V. S and Civil Defence. Considers the political and religious issues in Northern Ireland and notes an argument between Donal O'Sullivan and General Montgomery within the Irish Association. Notes on her stay with Louie Bennett, and thoughts on the North African Campaign of WWII. Also remarks on spending time with Katharine Johnston (née Coghill), who gave McNeill Edith Somerville's "latest production" *The Somerville Records* (a history of the Somerville family) to read. Mentions her invitation to the Mercier Society in Dublin, with Dean of Gloucester Dr Harold Costley-White as speaker.

Talks about new legislation for Criminal Justice Bill and attending meetings for Children's Guardian and Assistance Board. Becomes an Officer for Assistance Board of Northen Ireland.
