We are adjusting some phrasing so that there is a core set of aims and learning outcomes across each degree in the School, whilst also maintaining the additional subject specific aims and skills which are in current programme specifications.

Capital Markets FIN3013 is now optional, and is not a necessary co-requisite with Corporate Finance FIN3016.

For FIN2010 Investment Analysis, the coverage of corporate finance will be reduced, and coverage of asset pricing will increase.
