## Please note.....

- The year or semester that you spend abroad will **replace** the year or semester you would have spent at Queen's. The marks you achieve at your exchange university will be converted to Queen's grades and will contribute towards your degree classification\*
- Open to any full time Queen's University **undergraduate** student.
- You can go in 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup>/final year but must have the permission of your academic school
- There may be restrictions on certain subject areas, e.g. Psychology, Performing Arts & Business.
- Medical, Nursing, Biomedical Science, Social Work, Pharmacy or Law students cannot generally apply. If unsure please check with your School.

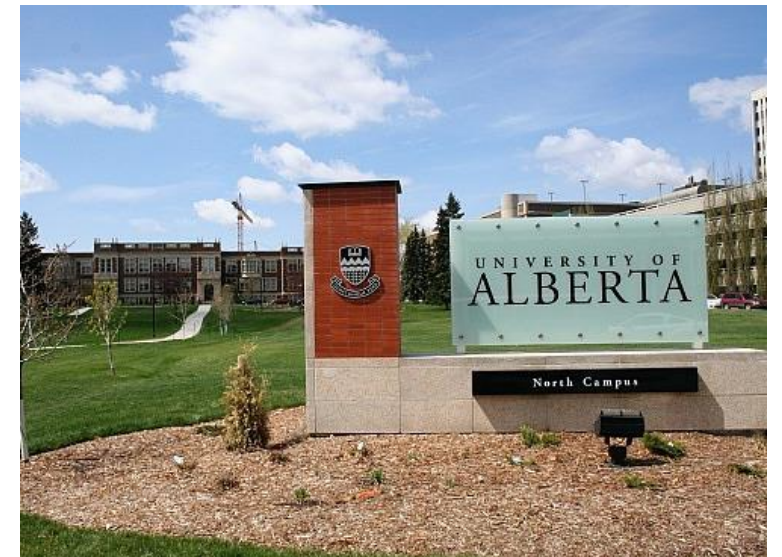
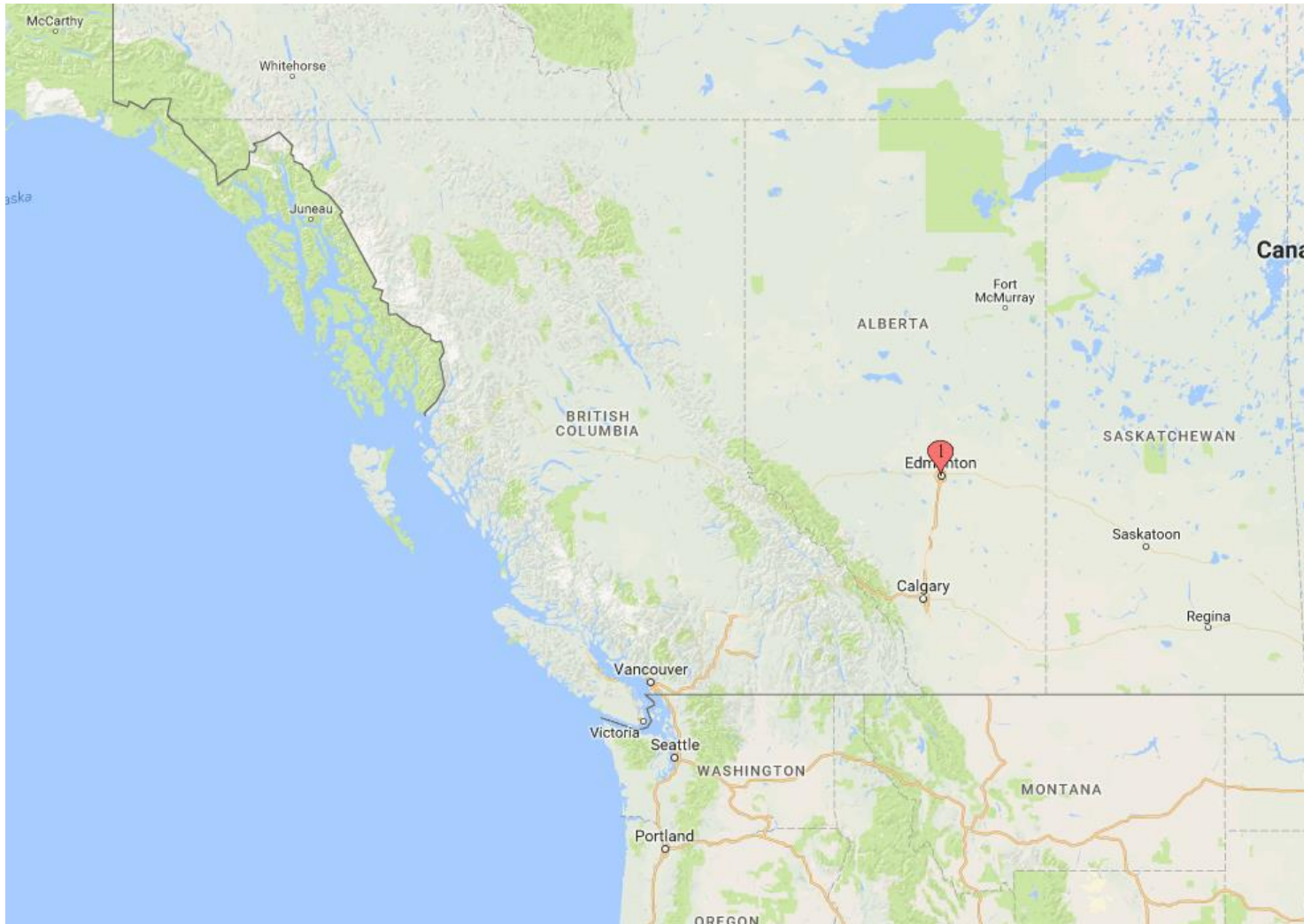

# Semester dates

- Queen's University, Kingston: Semester 1: early Sep – Dec 2023

- University of Alberta: Semester 1: early Sep – late Dec 2023  
Semester 2: early Jan – late April 2024
- University of Newcastle: Semester 2: July – November 2023  
Semester 1: late February 2024 – late June 2024

NB. Term dates will have impact on graduation for students going to UoN for full final year.



## Money matters

- You may be eligible for a Turing Grant\*
- Tuition fees.
  - NI/GB/EU students spending the full year in Kingston may be eligible for a tuition fee waiver for the 2023-24 year\*.
  - NI/GB/EU students spending only one semester will be required to pay the normal full tuition fee to QUB for the 2023-24 year.
  - International students spending either the full year or one semester will be required to pay the normal full tuition fee to QUB for the 2023-24 year.
- You are still eligible to claim Student Loans, maintenance grants etc.
- Students are required to organise and cover the cost of accommodation, visas, travel, health and insurance. Estimated costs available on notes for institutions

# Risk Assessment

- University requirement for an international work or study placement
- You must not travel before receiving formal approval from the University to do so.
- Asks questions about:
  - Travel guidance for your host country
  - Visa requirements for your host country
  - Academic contingency plan
  - Details of nearest relevant embassy/consulate
- Once submitted approval will be sought from School

# Application form

1. Personal details
2. Academic career and qualifications
3. Previous Work/Study Experience abroad
4. Evidence of extra-curricular activity
5. Personal Statement

**"Discuss your interest in your degree subject(s), how that interest developed and the way in which your exchange year at your first choice university will complement your studies at Queen's.  
Please comment on your proposed career and how the placement could be of benefit"**

## Components of the application to be in before deadline

- One completed application form, indicating, in rank order, your preferred universities. *You may indicate only one choice if you wish;*
- A provisional list of courses at the exchange institution **which you have ranked in first place**. This should be drawn up in consultation with your Adviser of Studies, the International Adviser or the Director of Education in your School.
- Nominate a reference from **a member of academic staff** at Queen's who can comment on your academic performance and abilities.

### **ENGL 206 History of English Language Units: 3.00**

A survey history of the English language from its origins in proto-Indo-European to the variety of contemporary world Englishes, with special emphasis on English as a language of literature.

LEARNING HOURS 120 (36L;84P).

### **ENGL 211 Medieval European Literature Units: 6.00**

Introduction to the literature of Britain and Western Europe from the twelfth to the fifteenth centuries. Non-English works are read in translation; some training in Middle English is provided. Readings may include romance, troubadour poetry, history and pseudo history, drama, women's writing, and authors such as Dante, Boccaccio, and Chaucer.

### **ENGL 212 Canterbury Tales Units: 3.00**

A study of Chaucer's major work intended to provide a comprehensive coverage of the tales and to consider the innovative nature of the text in its cultural, political, and literary contexts.

### **ENGL 213 15th & 16th Century Literature Units: 3.00**

A study of texts on both sides of the controversial boundary between the Middle Ages and the Renaissance. Texts are chosen to trace the development of a particular category of writing, such as courtly literature, religious writing, drama, or writing by women. Some texts are read in Middle English; language instruction is provided.

## Description

This course introduces students to the core area of physical chemistry, based around the themes of systems, states and processes. Topics covered are quantum mechanics and structure, chemical thermodynamics, phase changes, and chemical kinetics. Throughout the course, the relationship between physical phenomena and the molecular structure and reactions underpinning advanced materials will be highlighted. This content is designed to complement other 2000 level Chemistry courses which have a synthetic focus. The laboratory component provides training in a range of theoretical and applied physical chemistry techniques which are relevant to both industrial and research settings.
