

European Study Exchanges

- 1 semester or 1 academic year
- Open to any year group (some disciplines are restricted)
- Open to any nationality
- Turing or Irish Government funding <u>potentially</u> provides financial support for all full-time students*
- Range of exchanges with European Institutions (availability depends on subject)
- Speak with the International Exchange Advisor for your School
- Normal application closing date March

- Spend 1 semester or 1 academic year studying at one of the below institutions the US:
 - American University
 - Boston College
 - University of California Santa Cruz
 - University of Massachusetts Dartmouth or Lowell campus

 - * Further institutions may be added
- Funding <u>potentially</u> provides financial support for all full-time students*
- NI/GB/EU students spending the full year can potentially receive a tuition fee waiver

- Postgrad

- Spend 1 semester or 1 academic year studying at:
 - The University of Newcastle, Australia
 - Queen's University Kingston, Canada
 - University of Alberta, Canada
- Open to FT undergraduate students (Some subject restrictions)
- Turing funding <u>potentially</u> available
- International students pay the normal full tuition fee to QUB for the 2023-24 year.
- Information session 29th Nov, 1-2pm (Book via MyFuture)
- Applications open in Dec 22 | Closing date Feb 23

Graduates

• 180+ courses - Humanities, Business, Law, Science, Health, Tech

1-3 week courses

Costs:

- Global Opportunities covers course & accommodation (£1,400)
- Student covers Flights & spending money

Applications open in Semester 2



International Work Placements (Funding)

Placement must be between 1-12 months

✓ Undergrad✓ Postgrad✗ Graduates

- Optional or compulsory part of your degree
- Placement can be anywhere in the world
- Open to any nationality
- Turing or Irish Government funding <u>potentially</u> available for full time students*
- Application for funding via School Placement Coordinator/ office
- Normal funding application closing date 8 weeks prior to placement

Future Ready Skills for Leaders: New York 2024 Vindergrad * Postgrad Final year

- Open to 25 Undergraduate students (Any year & subject)
- Project "How might students contribute to Queen's becoming a Net Zero University by 2040"?
- On campus workshops & Training (Jan & March)
- Trip to New York (1-8 June 2024)
 - Company visits
 - Networking events
 - Cultural events
- Cost: £250 (2 X £125 instalments)
- Applications are now open and close on Tuesday 31st October (5pm)



IAESTE

✓ Postgrad

✓ Graduates

- Paid International placements- 6 weeks to 12 months
- Mostly STEM subjects & any nationality (2nd year+)
- Companies, Universities, Government bodies etc.
- IAESTE support e.g. choosing an employer, applying for visas, finding accommodation & settling into country
 e.g. USA, Japan, Austria, Germany, Hungary
- Costs include IAESTE placement fee (£200), flights/travel, visa, vaccinations costs and spending money. CES
 Scholarship available & salary included
- APPLICATIONS OPEN Rolling application dates

Undergraduate & Graduate Programme

J1 – 1 year Intern Visa (All passports*)

- This is for you if you have work or a placement already lined up prior to travel
- Open to QUB students with placements pre-set, or graduates with pre-placement
- Responsibility is on the student / graduate to source their own placement prior to applying for this visa
- Rian Center- Competitive visa costs and strong connections to Queen's



Mount Batten Programme

➤ Undergrad➤ Postgrad✓ Graduates (recent)

- 12-month USA Work Placement
- BlackRock, British Airways, Citibank, Fever Tree, HSBC
- Please note there is a programme cost of \$6,500
- Package worth more than USD \$25,000 including- coordination of visa, shared accommodation, health coverage, monthly stipend (\$1,275) & health coverage
- March and August start dates
- Eligibility: Non-US citizen, 2:2 classification & min 6 months professional experience required



Mitacs Globalink Research Internship – 24-25

- 12-week Research Internship (May 1st and October 31st)
- Supervision from Canadian University Staff
- Fully funded- flight, visa, accommodation, living stipend etc.
- All subject areas considered- Science, Engineering, Mathematics, Humanities and Social Sciences
- 45 universities across Canada
- Competitive application process

Eligibility

- 18 years of age
- FT UG in their 1st of a 3 yr or 2nd of a 4 yr programme
- 65%+ average
- Be fluent in the oral and written English and/or French



- Spend next summer working and living on a summer camp (9 weeks min)
- Different roles available
- A range of camps to choose from
- Costs apply (Approx. £700-800- Flights are included)
- Salaries vary (\$600-\$1250+)
- 30 days to travel in the USA after camp




