Study Exchange Funding





International Mobility Grant funding **potentially** provides financial support for all full-time students

- Funding sources include UK Government (Turing Scheme), Irish Government and Queen's
- Funding paid to you by Global Opportunities in two instalments
- 2024-25 rates (per month)
 Approx £420 or £360* depending on country. (Grouped by cost of living)

Group 1 (high cost of living) (£14 per day)	Group 2 (medium / low cost of living) (£12 per day)
Australia, Canada, Norway, Switzerland, United States	All other countries



- Be prepared to cover some costs up front helps cover some costs
- Requires the return of funding documents
- Additional funding available for students from a Widening Participation background.
 - *based on a 30-day month and placement between 57 365 days

Can I apply for a student loan or maintenance grant from the SLC for this time? Yes



International Mobility Grant Funding examples

Example 1 (year-long placement)

- Student going to Germany on a 250-day placement (Group 2 country/Low cost of living)
 = £12 per day x 250 days = £3,000
- Student going to Germany on a 250-day placement from a disadvantaged background
 = £16 per day x 250 days = £4,000 + travel costs of up to £250 + visa costs = £4,250

Example 2 (semester long placement)

- Student going to Australia on a 100-day placement (Group 1 country/High cost of living)
 = £14 per day x 100 days = £1,450
- Student going to Australia on a 100-day placement from a disadvantaged background
 = £18 per day x 100 days = £1,800 + travel costs of up to £1,360 + visa costs = £3,160



Tuition Fees for Study Exchange

No tuition fees payable to your host university

(may be costs associated with orientation or language courses)

Single semester exchange = full tuition fee payable to Queen's

Full year exchange + NI/GB/ROI fee paying student + International Mobility

Grant = no tuition fee payable to Queen's

not yet confirmed for future years

not currently available for students undertaking work placements in ROI

Full year exchange + international fee paying student = full tuition fee payable to Queen's



Work Placement Funding outside of UK

International Mobility Grant funding may also be available

How might this apply to my placement?

- Placement must be minimum of one month (28 days)
- Compulsory part of your degree
- Placement can be anywhere in the world
- Open to any nationality
- Application for funding via School Placement Coordinator/Office
- Additional criteria is the same as for a study exchange country rates, instalments, and amounts.

The Clinton Scholarship Fund

Eligibility:

- Any year of undergraduate study other than your final year
- be a resident of Northern Ireland and qualify for fees at "Home Student" status

And meet at least one of the following:

- Be a participant on the Queen's Pathways Programme
- be a participant on the Queen's Senior Academy Programme
- have an annual household income of £25,000 or less
- you were in the care of a Health and Social Care Trust or Local Authority for three months or more from the age of 14 years

The Clinton Scholarships (Strand 1) - USA Study Exchanges

Strand 1 allows you to spend 1 semester or 1 academic year studying at a US partner university.

The Clinton Scholarships (Strand 1) - USA Study Exchanges

Up to £12,000 per semester to cover:

- Flights
- Accommodation
- Visa
- Medical insurance
- Day to day costs
- 5 Clinton Scholarships available
- Students spending the full year can potentially receive a tuition fee waiver (to be confirmed for 25/26)



The Clinton Scholarships (Strand 2) – Clinton Career Insights Programme

Strand 2 combines campus project-based workshops and events with a 1 week visit to a US city to meet Queen's alumni, organisations and leaders with networking events in professional settings

• 15 Undergraduate Widening Participation students (not final year students)

Think Pacific - Fiji and Bali

Volunteering Expedition in country

- See Fiji through the eyes of the local people and live at the heart of a remote Fijian village
- 1 or 2 months 6 x Funded places being offered by Queen's* (International Mobility Grant funded/not fully funded)
- Placements mental health projects, building/ development projects, Environmental projects

Virtual Internships

- 40 fully funded places (TBC for summer 2025):
 - School of AEL 5 UG scholarships
 - School of SSESW 5 UG scholarships
 - School of Psychology 5 scholarships (UG and PGT)
 - School of HAPP 10 UG scholarships (must be second or third year)
 - Any UG or PGT student 15 scholarships
- Contribute to Fiji's development plan from the comfort of your home
- 4/8 or 12 weeks Research, Cultural awareness sessions, Project delivery
- Programme Fees apply bursaries available from TP & Queen's Careers


