Meet Cedar, a Go Global Ambassador, who spent a semester at the University of Alberta studying history. Here's how Cedar arranged accommodation in Edmonton!

"I decided to try and get a place in one of their large student accommodations. I was fortunate the university guarantees incoming exchange students accommodation as private options are limited in the city.



Booking accommodation was straightforward using an online portal. To me picking a place to stay which was well connected with facilities including transport, shops, restaurants and all the essentials was important for my studies in Alberta. There are two types of accommodation here, a 2 person and 4 person flat, each with one kitchen and bathroom, and your roommates are randomly allocated, but you can put in a roommate request.

My top tip would be if you're booking University accommodation for your exchange make the most of the induction events – they're great for meeting people and finding out about the university and city."
