Application and selection process



Eligibility

- Full Time **Undergraduate** Queen's University students (Including integrated Masters degrees e.g. MSci or MEng) any year or subject
- Students are not eligible if they have already participated in or been offered a place on the following programmes:
 - a University Exchange to Europe, USA, Canada or Australia
 - Belfast to Berlin Programme
 - Mitacs Research Internship
 - Utrecht Summer School
 - Clinton Career Insight Programme
 - Global Leadership or Future Ready Skills for Leaders, New York programme
 - Or been in receipt of Global Opportunities Mobility Funding eg a Work/ Study
 Placement Year abroad or AHSS or EPS funding for an international programme

Selection Criteria

Essential criteria:

- Understanding of the programme and motivation to participate in all aspects of the experience (before, during and after the week in the Copenhagen & Lund)
- An interest in the Theme
- Be an active contributor to the programme demonstrating enthusiasm, relevant skills and strengths including:
 - Initiative, drive and resilience to take on challenges
 - Communication and teamwork
 - Problem solving and innovation
 - Responsible and organised

Desirable criteria:

- Confidence with social media and video production
- Previous sustainability knowledge and experience (not essential)



What are we looking for?

- Students will be working in teams, so we are looking for people with a range of skills and experiences.
- We want to see your motivation for addressing this particular theme and what perspective you
 could bring to address this challenge: How might students contribute to Queen's becoming a Net
 Zero University by 2040?

- We want to see evidence of how you meet the essential and desirable selection criteria
- We welcome applications from people who already have leadership experience and/or international experience as well as those who have experience of neither

How to Apply?

Complete the **Application Form** by 5pm Monday 27th October

- Personal details & confirm eligibility
- Answer 3 Key Questions:
- 1.Discuss why you would like to participate in Queen's Global Leadership Programme? (maximum 300 word)
- 2. Please discuss what you hope to gain from the programme? (maximum 300 word)
- 3. The theme for the Leadership Programme is; "How might students contribute to Queen's becoming a Net Zero University by 2040?" Tell us which one of the following topics, related to the theme, interests you most & why? (Supply chains, Energy, Buildings, Travel, Waste, Biodiversity)

Alternatively, if you want to suggest your own topic, please do so and state why.





Visa

- We will be flying:
 - Dublin to Copenhagen
 - Copenhagen- Amsterdam- Belfast



- We expect that most students will not require a visa, but you should check your personal circumstances. Some students may require an additional visa to fly from Dublin
- Students are responsible for arranging and paying their own visas for travel. Check your eligibility before applying to this programme.
- If a student is offered a place on this programme but is unable to arrange a visa in time, their place will be offered to another student (February 2026)
- We cannot advise on specific visa requirements, but we can provide supporting letters



Costs

- £150-3 instalments of 1x £50 (Dec), 1x £50 (Feb), 1 £50 (April)
- Queen's covers flights, accommodation & breakfast



 It is recommended that students bring enough funds to have around £50 per day to cover their expenses- lunch, dinner, social activities
