






## **What is Study USA?**

- Study USA is a generously funded scholarship programme providing an opportunity to study at a US College for one academic year
- Funded by the Department for the Economy
- Delivered by the British Council
- Began in 1994
- 50-60 places available in a typical year









#### The programme provides students with:

- The opportunity to develop an outward-looking, international experience to develop their global awareness
- The opportunity to explore new teaching styles
- The opportunity to improve your core employability skills
- The opportunity to build your confidence, adaptability and resilience
- The opportunity to raise economic, cultural and political awareness of Northern Ireland in the USA
- The opportunity to develop the skills necessary to become future global leaders within the Northern Ireland economy
- The opportunity to begin developing your international network







## **Eligibility Criteria**

- Must be classified as having Northern Ireland, Republic of Ireland or Great Britain residency for tuition fee purposes.
- Must be in full-time education, studying any discipline.
- Must have obtained a minimum 1<sup>st</sup> year average of 57%
- Must apply in level 2 year of study. \*QUB, Ulster University,
   Stranmillis, Union Theological College
- Medicine and Dentistry students must obtain school permission before applying.
- Must not have previously participated in a student mobility programme funded by a Northern Ireland Executive



\*NOTE – International or EU students (excluding Ireland) are not eligible for Study USA



## **Campus Life at a US College**

- Closely-knit campus community
- Alcohol is not as central to socialising
- Focus on extracurricular activities with many sports on offer
- Living in a dorm with a roommate
- Eating on campus with a meal plan
- Clubs, societies and volunteering opportunities







## **Academic Life at a US College**

- Smaller class sizes (20-30 students)
- Close working relationship with professors
- Continuous assessment throughout the year
- Graded on class participation and attendance
- Heavier academic workload with nightly homework, regular assessments, quizzes and group work







#### **Student Support**

Study USA students receive a great level of support in advance and whilst in the USA

Students <u>must attend</u> our three pre-departure workshops and will also receive a Study USA Student Handbook

- 1. They will have a designated International Advisor on campus in the US to assist day to day queries
- 2. They can access Wellbeing Services on campus in the US
- 3. They can still access their Wellbeing Team at home
- 4. We have a Student Support Advisor (based in Pittsburgh)
- 5. Ongoing support from the Study USA team during your year







#### Classes while in the USA each semester

#### What will I study?

- 2 x classes related to your home discipline (40%)
- 2 x classes from this list (40%)
- 1 x elective class e.g. Art, Sports, Humanities (20%)
- You are required to maintain GPA 3.0 across all your classes throughout the year
- You will be registered as a Junior student (Year 3)
- Most Study USA students will take 200 level (Sophomore classes)

Complete 30 x class credits during the year (minimum 15 class credits each semester)

Minimum 15 x hours class time per week

- 1. Maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 (83%+ / B grade) across all classes each semester
- 2. Complete 5 x Ambassadorial Presentations on Northern Ireland
- 3. 1 x written assignment and 1 x video Personal Development Portfolio on completion
- 4. Complete a business project (QUB & UU students)

NOTE: Students who do not achieve a 3.0 at the end of their fall semester will be withdrawn from the programme and will not return to the US for spring semester.





#### £50,000 Scholarship Package

The scholarship funding package, includes:

- Accommodation on a US campus (shared dorm) for the academic year
- One return flight to the US
- Tuition fees paid by the participating US colleges and universities (\*average in 25/26 \$41,000)
- A full meal plan
- A \$1,000 textbook allowance
- A \$250 allowance each semester for elective classes
- A £1000 bursary paid directly to all students when they successfully return to US for spring semester

## **Costs To Consider – Money Matters...**

Programme participants must fund the following:

Commitment Fee *	£200 (reimbursed spring semester in US)
Travel & Medical Insurance	£600+ approximately
Visa Costs	£600 approximately
Spending Money	
Out of term time costs	e.g. accommodation/ food
Travel within the USA	



Students are **NOT** eligible for student finance whilst on the Study USA programme.


\*Should a student fail to pay the £200 Commitment Fee within seven calendar days, their place on the programme will be revoked and offered to a candidate on the reserve list. The £200 Commitment Fee will be repaid to the student with their £1000 bursary at the start the second semester in the USA

Any student who does not achieve a 3.0 GPA and fulfil the requirements of the programme to graduate by the end of the academic year, will be required to repay the cost of their flight, plus the £1,000 bursary and the reimbursed £200 commitment fee that were paid at the beginning of spring semester.

## Characteristics of a good Study USA student

- Shows a good understanding of all aspects of the programme.
- Displays a genuine interest in academics at US college.
- Will have passed all exams/modules and have no coursework/exams outstanding by the end of June 2026.
- Will be a good ambassador for Northern Ireland.
- Will volunteer and actively participate in campus life / local community
- Understands how participation in Study USA will impact upon future graduate career plan.










#### **The Recruitment Process**

- Formal interviews in Belfast in December 2025.
- Applicants will be asked questions related to the application form, and knowledge of the programme.
- The top HE candidates (normally 50- 60) will be offered a place mid December 2025.
- Reserve list students may receive a place.
- Several places are ring-fenced for applicants from Further Education Colleges.







#### **The Recruitment Process - Timeline**

HE Application Deadline	23:59 – Sunday 09 November 2025
HE Interviews	December 2025
US College Matching Meetings	February 2026

#### Remember!

- Candidates shortlisted based on answers to 6 x questions (max. 200 words per answer).
- Answer the questions directly and in detail with specific examples rather than vague statements.
- Get your application proofread.
- If called for interview, liaise with the Careers Department to arrange a practice interview.
