The Degree Plus award allows full time & part time students to gain accreditation for skills developed outside of their academic programme, for example, through part-time work, volunteering, sports, clubs and societies or additional courses such as Insight into Management. Students who successfully complete the programme will receive the award of Degree Plus when they graduate. In a competitive graduate job market, Degree Plus is a positive way of developing your employability skills and setting yourself apart from the crowd.

Structure of Programme: Degree Plus gives students a choice of two routes to achieve the qualification which must be completed by March of final year at the latest. The two routes comprise:

Route A: Full Accreditation

Each year, many Queen's students undertake other courses or programmes in addition to their degree. For example, some students spend a year studying at a university in the United States under the Study USA programme. Programmes and activities like this allow students to acquire the skills and experience that the Degree Plus Award recognises, so, if you are interested in finding out about programmes under Route A why not visit the Degree Plus website and begin the process of making your interests work for you.

The programmes which represent Route A to the Degree Plus Award typically lead to a Certificate or Diploma in their own right. For example, students who successfully complete Study USA gain the Certificate in American Business Practice. They require significant input and work.

STUDY AND WORK PLACEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Would you like to spend from three months to one year studying or working in another European country; or studying in Canada or Australia, as a recognised part of your degree?

Each year, the Erasmus Programme enables more than 100 students at Level 2 and above to study at selected EU and EEA universities which have exchange agreements with Queen's in specific subject areas. There is a limited number of Erasmus grants available for participating students, which are in addition to the normal student loan. Also, approximately 150 students undertake Erasmus work placements in Europe as an integral part of their degree programmes.

The amount of the Erasmus grant depends on the country you visit and the length of time spent abroad. It won't be a large amount, but is designed to help cover the extra cost-of-living. A contribution towards travel is included in the amount you receive.

Students who went on an Erasmus study or work placement during 2013-2014 for the <u>full academic year</u>, and who were eligible for UK student loans, also received a tuition fee waiver at Queen's, so it could save you approx. £3000! This tuition fee waiver is a UK government concession and is reviewed annually.

Outside Europe, the University currently has exchange opportunities with the following universities.

- The University of Newcastle, New South Wales, Australia
- Queen's University, Kingston, Ontario, Canada
- The University of Alberta, Edmonton, Canada

There is a tuition fee waiver at the partner university, and successful applicants will receive a travel award.

The year or semester spent abroad will replace the similar period at Queen's and the courses taken will count towards your degree. Students undertaking study placements abroad as a recognised element of their degree are eligible to apply for the placement to be considered towards the Queen's Degree Plus award. The award provides official recognition by the University of the non-academic benefits of an Erasmus or exchange placement, such as improved employability skills, global and cultural awareness and increased self-confidence and motivation.
