Programmes with work placement integrated

- BSc Agricultural Technology (provided in conjunction with CAFRE Greenmount campus)
- BSc Food Quality, Safety and Nutrition
- MSci Food Science and Food Security

Work placement recruitment options

Placement is carried out between second year and final year of the student programme

 Option one - 16 week placement to be carried out between Easter and September

- Option two 46 week placement to be carried out after second year enabling the student to return to final year commencing late September
- Based on a 35 hour working week

What types of employment do our students seek?

Agriculture – Students have previously secured placements in a range of agricultural production related roles and supporting industries. Areas include – Industry based roles including Meat, Dairy and Poultry industries (farm quality assurance, primary production, traceability), trainee farm management, farm liaison and support, industry related farm trials, sales and business development activities, harvesting, agronomy, plant breeding and crop related roles, horticulture, animal feeds

companies and nutrition, agricultural stakeholder organisations, agricultural research institutes working on a broad range of agri-research projects. Many students have gained experience internationally and links are currently established with employers in Australia, New Zealand, Canada and the US.

Food – Students have previously secured placements in a range of food manufacturing industries, food research related roles as well as organisations working in health related sectors. Areas include industry based roles product development (development assistant, development technology and nutritional input), technical and quality (quality assurance technician, food technology) HACCP and food safety, audit preparation (BRC and SALSA) and additional regulatory related roles, supplier liaison and buying, marketing and business development, product promotion, social media presence, waste minimisation and environmental management projects, food research within industry and research institutes working on a broad range of food science laboratory based projects. Students will have completed the CIEH Level 3 Qualification in Food Safety Supervision for Manufacturing prior to commencing placement.

Recruitment Timeline

Work Placement Student

- (October to March) advertise and promote opportunities. It is also possible to come on campus to meet students
- (January to March) a busy time for placement interviews. Interviews can be accommodated on site
- (May to September) students typically commence placement

Graduate Recruitment

- Graduate recruitment is now an all year round activity. Please provide details of vacancies as early as possible to allow adequate time for selection
- (January to June) a busy time for Graduate recruitment, email any vacancies directly to m.gallagher@qub.ac.uk and recruit@qub.ac.uk
