## Eligibility:

- Out of 24 places, 20 will be allocated to QUMS students (any course, any level). Leaving 4 places open to students from any School.
- Due to employer requirements students must have:
  - 300 UCAS points or equivalent
  - A minimum 60% average in university modules
- Priority may be given to students from under-represented QUMS courses

## How to apply:

- There is a competitive application process through which applicants must demonstrate their motivation and commitment to working in this sector in London.
