THE PROGRAMME

The Senior Academy has been established to support students in non-selective schools and further education colleges in developing their potential to progress to Queen's University, Belfast. Fifty students from across Northern Ireland will be nominated by their teachers/tutors to participate in a programme of activities and events between April 2015 and May 2016.

As part of the programme participants will have the opportunity to:

- develop academic skills including: essay writing, note taking, revision and critical thinking
- Develop personal skills including: team work, time management and self confidence
- Access up to 30 hours of subject specific tutoring
- Team up with an undergraduate student mentor to find out what student life is like.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Pupils from a family with little or no experience of Higher Education. *

Currently in the first year of a two year, level 3 qualification e.g. A-levels or acceptable equivalent BTEC/OCR qualification

Attending a Northern Ireland non-selective school or further education college

Have at least 5 A* - C grades at GCSE (or equivalent e.g. GNVQ, BTEC) including English and Maths*

In addition, nominees **must** also meet at least **two** of the following criteria:

- Annual household income of below £19,203
- In receipt of Educational Maintenance Allowance (EMA)
- Have a disability or additional learning need
- Currently living in Care or are Care Experienced
- Is the main carer for a family member or dependant.

NOMINATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

1. School/teacher nomination
2. Pupils complete applications and personal statements
3. School/teacher submit student references
4. Students meet the WPU Team
5. Offers made /accepted
6. Induction Day
