



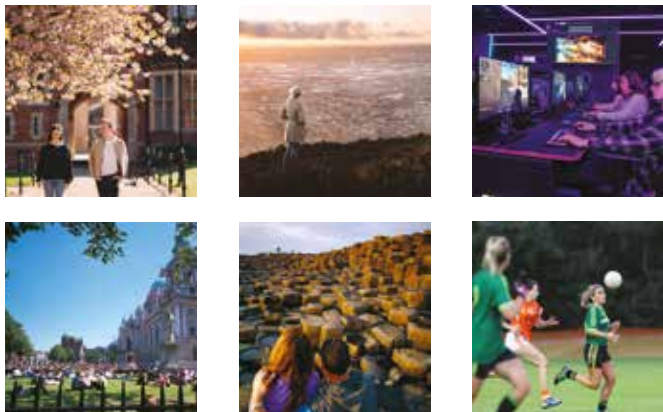

WELCOME TO QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY BELFAST

Queen's University Belfast was founded by Royal Charter in 1845, the 9th oldest university in the UK. A world-leading university with over 175-year history, it has a unique past and a vibrant academic environment. As a centre of excellence, Queen's has been awarded the Queen's Anniversary Prize

seven times, one of the highest honours awarded to higher and further education institutions in the UK. Queen's is also a proud member of the Russell Group and one of the leading universities in the UK providing world-class education underpinned by world-class research.

Applying to study in the UK is quite different to applying to colleges in the Canada. There are some big differences, like choosing a major before you apply!

UK university admissions are centred on the concept of academic merit and potential. With our three year degree programmes, we want to know that our students are prepared academically to meet the challenges of their chosen subject head on – so our entry requirements focus on the capability of an applicant to succeed primarily in the classroom as evidenced in their prior academic attainment and focus of study if there are subject specific requirements. We want all of our students to be able to thrive in the learning environment we provide and our approach to admissions is designed to support this goal.

What we consider

- Your academic record – in the form of your high school transcript and any tests and academic achievements
- Your academic suitability – in the form of demonstrated knowledge and understanding of the subject area, and your personality as a student

Academic background

- Transcripts, exams taken and exams you plan to take – these are used to evaluate your academic suitability

Personal statement

- This is used to assess your understanding of the subject area, and for you to demonstrate why you would make a good student at QUB

The grades required for admission to our undergraduate degree programmes will vary to your chosen course of study. The Course Finder on our website show detailed requirements for every course – normally expressed in the terms of three A-Level grades. The following qualifications will be considered for direct entry to our undergraduate programmes. The grades required will vary according to your chosen programme. Please check our Course Finder for detailed entry requirements.

The Canadian High School Diploma (Grade 12).

The minimum requirement is usually 75 - 80% overall, although some programmes do require higher grades and may specify exact grade requirements in relevant subjects.

Alberta: A General High School Diploma with an average of at least 75 - 80% in five acceptable grade 12 courses.

British Columbia: the Senior Secondary Graduation Diploma with at least five Bs in acceptable grade 12 courses and 75 - 80% overall.

Manitoba: the High School Graduation Diploma with five credits awarded at 300 level in at least four subject areas and at least 75% achieved in each of these areas.

Ontario: The Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) is required normally with an average of 80% in six Grade 12 U/M courses. Certain programmes may require Grade 12 U/M courses in specific subjects.

Saskatchewan: the Grade 12 Standing/ Division IV Standing (Secondary School Diploma) with an average of at least 75 - 80% in five acceptable subjects.

Between 30 and 36 points in the International Baccalaureate Diploma (IB).

INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Queen's University Belfast offers a variety of International scholarships.

North America Future Leaders Award

3 awards of £7,000 towards tuition fees for the first year of undergraduate study. The award is for high achieving students who can also demonstrate a commitment to leadership within their local or global community.

Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship:

50% tuition fees paid up to a maximum of four years (application required; terms and conditions apply)

International Office Scholarship:

£3,500-£4,000 (deducted from first-year gross tuition fees upon enrolment; full-time Undergraduate programme, exclusions apply)

Early Confirmation Award:

£1,500 tuition fee reduction when paying tuition fees in full by the appropriate deadline (may be used in conjunction with other scholarships if conditions have been met; terms and conditions apply)

Queen's Family Scholarship:

20% tuition fee reduction on year 1 (terms and conditions apply)

Queen's Excellence Award:

£3,000 merit-based award for students who achieve a 60% GPA in the academic year 2025/26 and exceptional students who maintain a minimum GPA of 60% may receive this award in consecutive years (terms and conditions apply)

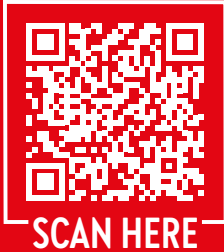

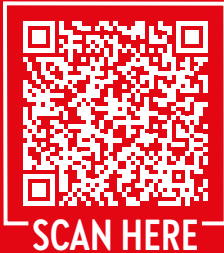
