What are reasonable adjustments?




A reasonable adjustment is any measure that helps reduce or remove barriers caused by a disability to ensure fair access to learning.


Examples include:

- Extra time for assessments & exams
- Extended library loans
- Advance access to reading lists & lecture materials
- Consideration for presentations (e.g. smaller group, understanding of condition)
- Exam adjustments (e.g. rest breaks, extra time)
- Assistive Technology to support learning

Funded Support

Disabled Students' Allowance:

Students with a long-term condition, disability or specific learning difficulty and **evidence** of this, should be entitled to **additional**, funded support (one-to-one assistance, equipment, software etc) to help with their studies.

Applying:

Apply through **Student Finance - SFNI** / Education Authority (EA) for NI students or equivalent funding bodies (**SFE** / **SFW** / **SAAS**) for GB students.


Assessing:

A professional Needs Assessor will meet with student (either in-person in **One Elmwood** or **remotely / online**) to chat about study challenges, explore various solutions, demonstrate assistive technology software and develop an **individualised / tailored support plan**.



Student Wellbeing

- Mental Health & Wellbeing Support- Daily drop-in, one-to-one appointments, and ongoing support
- Create a support plan and signpost to internal and external services
- **Counselling Service-** Professional counselling available to all students and 24/7 helpline
- Safe & Healthy Relationships / Report & Support- Support with harassment, bullying, sexual misconduct, hate incidents, spiking scams
- **Risk Management-** linking students presenting at risk with primary & urgent care providers and de-escalation support

What to tell prospective students...

- **Disclosure will not be held against you-** Encourage students to tick the disability box on UCAS form
- Start Early (meet us at the April Offer Holder event) Engage with support services as soon as possible to ensure a smooth transition
- Apply for funded support (i.e. DSA) early The process can take time, so apply as soon as possible
- Take Responsibility Reach out and complete any necessary steps to access the support available
- Seek Out Additional Support Services such as Accommodation, Careers, Global Opportunities and other services can help students thrive
- **Keep in Touch** If students experience any issues, they should contact us- we are here to help







UK Graduate Labour Market in 2025

- Graduate recruitment down 14.6% compared to previous year
- Largest falls were in Technology (44% and Accountancy Professional Services (32%)
- Projections 2025 26 suggest it is likely to fall for the third year running.




