

WELCOME TO QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY BELFAST

Queen's University Belfast was founded by Royal Charter in 1845, the 9th oldest university in the UK. A world-leading university celebrating a 180 year history, it has a unique past and a vibrant academic environment. As a centre of excellence, Queen's has been awarded the Queen's Anniversary Prize

seven times, one of the highest honours awarded to higher and further education institutions in the UK. Queen's is also a proud member of the Russell Group and one of the leading universities in the UK providing world-class education underpinned by world-class research.

Applying to study in the UK is quite different to applying to colleges in the USA. There are some big differences - like choosing a major before you apply!

UK university admissions are centred on the concept of academic merit and potential. With our three year degree programmes, we want to know that our students are prepared academically to meet the challenges of their chosen subject head on – so our entry requirements focus on the capability of an applicant to succeed primarily in the classroom as evidenced in their prior academic attainment and focus of study if there are subject specific requirements. We want all of our students to be able to thrive in the learning environment we provide and our approach to admissions is designed to support this goal.

Entry requirements at QUB

The grades required for admission to our undergraduate degree programmes will vary to your chosen course of study. At Queen's, we accept a combination of qualifications which can be used to meet our academic entry requirements. Students may submit a mixture of qualifications, a combination of 3, to meet the entrance requirements*:

- AP exam score
- SAT 1
- ACT
- Honors class grade
- · College or dual enrollment class grade
- IB Higher Level subject test

*Exception: Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Nursing & Midwifery, and Social Work

At a minimum, students are therefore required to submit at least one Honors grade *OR* AP test score. Where there are subject specific requirements to be met (e.g. A-Level Chemistry is a requirement for entrance to BSc Chemistry), students typically must submit a cognate AP test or Honors grade such as AP Chemistry or Honors Chemistry to meet the subject requirement.

Applicants who have successfully completed an associate degree with an overall GPA of 3.0/4.0 awarded by a recognised US institution will be considered for admission to Stage 1 of an undergraduate degree programme. Any subject requirements must be met.

For example, if the requirement for a QUB course is BBB at A-Level, the following combination is possible. Two Honors class grades with minimum Grade B Plus one from:

- · AP test score with minimum of 4
- SAT I test with a minimum score of 1290
- ACT test with a minimum score of 27. You can use the table below for US qualifications and grade requirements which we deem comparable to UK A-Levels.

Some Important Things to Note:

- Subjects cannot be counted twice if you're taking AP US History, you cannot also submit an Honors class in US History.
- You do not need to have taken the tests before you apply – we can issue offers based on tests you are planning to take in your Senior year.

North America Future Leaders Award

3 awards of 50% off of Year 1 tuition fees for undergraduate study. The award is for high achieving students who can also demonstrate a commitment to leadership within their local or global community.

The Norman Houston Award For Study Abroad applicants from the USA

This award has been created in memory of the late Norman Houston, friend of Queen's and former Director of the Northern Ireland Bureau in the USA. One award will be provided each academic year to provide a full tuition-fee and accommodation waiver for an exceptional visiting (Study Abroad) student from the USA.

Vice-Chancellor's International Attainment Scholarship:

50% tuition fees paid up to a maximum of four years (application required; terms and conditions apply)

International Office Scholarship:

£3,500-£4,000 (deducted from first-year gross tuition fees upon enrolment; full-time Undergraduate programme, exclusions apply)

Early Confirmation Award:

£1,500 tuition fee reduction when paying tuition fees in full by the appropriate deadline (may be used in conjunction with other scholarships if conditions have been met; terms and conditions apply)

Queen's Family Scholarship:

20% tuition fee reduction on year 1 (terms and conditions apply)

Queen's Excellence Award:

£3,000 merit-based award for students who achieve a 60% GPA in the academic year 2026/27 and exceptional students who maintain a minimum GPA of 60% may receive this award in consecutive years
