

Not only does this help to reduce the cost of study, but also complements the fact that Belfast has the lowest cost of living in the UK (Mercer.com, 2014).

The University's own Students' Union plays host to bands, comedy gigs and other entertainment on a regular basis and there is also a full-time cinema, the Queen's Film Theatre (QFT) on campus.



QUEEN'S OFFERS 4 GENERAL STUDY ABROAD OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS FROM NORTH AMERICA:



1 UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES (BACHELORS FULL DEGREE)

Primarily three years in length (unless they include an additional work placement year) and enable specialisation from the start of study.

Undergraduate Entry Requirements:

USA

- US High School Diploma with a minimum CGPA of 3.0 on a scale of 4.0 PLUS
- An ACT test with a minimum score of 27 OR an SAT I test with a minimum score of 1800 (600 Critical Reading, 600 Writing and 600 Mathematics) PLUS
- Either:
 - a. Two Advanced Placement (AP) tests at Grade 5 OR two SAT II subject tests at 650 or above. In both cases, these should be in relevant subjects if there are specific course requirements
 - b. Three Advanced Placement (AP) tests at Grade 4 OR three SAT II subject test at 600 or above

When submitting SAT score reports, please use the Queen's Designated Institution (DI) code: 7753

Canada

The Canadian High School Diploma (Grade 12) with minimum requirement of 75-80 per cent overall.

Alberta: A General High School Diploma with an average of at least 75 per cent in five acceptable grade 12 courses.

British Columbia: the Senior Secondary Graduation Diploma with at least five Bs in acceptable grade 12 courses and 75-80 per cent overall.

Manitoba: the High School Graduation Diploma with five credits awarded at 300 level in at least four subject areas and at least 75 per cent achieved in each of these areas.

Ontario: the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) is required normally with an average of 80 per cent in six Grade 12 U/M courses. Certain programmes may require Grade 12 U/M courses in specific subjects.

Saskatchewan: the Grade 12 Standing/ Division IV Standing (Secondary School Diploma) with an average of at least 75 per cent in five acceptable subjects.

International Baccalaureate Diploma: Entry requirements range from 29-37 points overall depending on the degree programme.

NB: The standards required for individual degree programmes may vary with higher requirements for the very competitive degree programmes eg Medicine, Law and Pharmacy. Exact grade requirements in relevant subjects may be specified. Students may also be expected to submit additional application materials and those interested in Medicine are advised to make arrangements for UK Clinical Aptitude Test (www.ukcat.ac.uk) during the summer prior to application.

2 POSTGRADUATE STUDIES (MASTERS AND PHDS)

Masters degrees are generally one year in duration with most including a combination of coursework and research. Students are also welcome to apply for PhD programmes, which are research intensive and last three to four years.

Postgraduate Entry Requirements:

Masters Degree – four-year Bachelors degree with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.8 will be considered although most courses will require a 3.2 GPA. For most courses, your major subject or content of your Bachelors degree may also be considered.

MPhil/PhD – a good four-year Bachelors degree plus, normally, a good Masters degree.

NB: The taught Masters degree refers to a programme that combines academic instruction as well as the completion of a written dissertation or research project.

3 STUDY ABROAD

Over 100 visiting students from North America come to study at Queen's each year on the Study Abroad and Exchange programme.

Visiting students spend either an academic year or semester studying at Queen's, where they can choose from a broad range of modules (classes) across the whole range of university courses (some exceptions such as medicine), as long as they meet the pre-requisites for the given course.

Students from any accredited university can apply.

Study Abroad Entry Requirements:

Applicants should normally have completed one year of university undergraduate study at the time of application and should hold a CGPA of 3.0.

Where possible, students should discuss their plans to study abroad with the International Office/Study Abroad Office at their home institution to ensure transferability of credit, etc. Applications and enquiries can be sent directly to studyabroad@qub.ac.uk

4 INTERNATIONAL SUMMER SCHOOLS

A three-week Summer School is available during July and August in Irish Studies and Conflict Transformation. Exploring history, literature, law, languages, politics, anthropology, sociology, film and theatre, students are also given the opportunity to meet with some of Northern Ireland's decision makers such as key politicians, church and community leaders. These credit-bearing programmes include field

trips to sites of historical, political and cultural interest in Belfast and Northern Ireland.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

If English is not your first language, you will need to demonstrate a minimum level of English. Queen's University requires the equivalent of 6.0 IELTS or TOEFL iBT 80 – 90. Minimum scores will be required in each component of the test. Some courses, however, have higher requirements (please check with the International Office).

1 CHOOSE YOUR QUEEN'S DEGREE PROGRAMME

2 SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

Undergraduate – apply through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service at www.ucas.com. This is the UK's one-stop shop for undergraduate applications. Deadline is **30 June** (except Medicine and Dentistry which is 15 October) although it is recommended to apply by **15 January**. If you are applying only to Queen's and not to another UK university or for Medicine or Dentistry, you can apply directly by completing our direct application form, downloadable from go.qub.ac.uk/InternationalApplicants

Postgraduate – apply directly through Queen's on our Direct Online Portal <https://dap.qub.ac.uk/portal> Early application is recommended, especially as for some courses we receive more applications than there are places available.

3 RECEIVE AN OFFER

Our International Admissions team will be in touch via email and letter to advise if we can make you an offer (conditional or unconditional), require more information or if you have been unsuccessful. If you have not heard back within a few weeks of your application submission, you can email to check your status via intl.student@qub.ac.uk

4 SELECTING AND CONFIRMING YOUR OFFER

You need to accept your offer (whether conditional or unconditional) so we know if you intend to take up your place and can hold it for you. Also remember to submit your final exam scores when available, to show you have met the conditions of your offer and to enable your status to be updated to unconditional.

5 APPLYING FOR YOUR VISA AND ARRIVING AT QUEEN'S

Once you have firmly accepted an unconditional offer and paid any necessary deposits, you will be issued with a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS – not issued earlier than six months before start date) which you will need to apply for your Tier 4 Visa. 

US FEDERAL LOANS

Queen's is approved by the US Department of Education for participation in the Federal Direct Loan programme. Our School Code is G22736. There are three types of US Federal Loans – Subsidized, Unsubsidized and Plus Loans. Graduate students, or undergraduate students and their parents, can normally borrow up to the full cost of attendance of their programme (including tuition, subsistence and airfare).


