Pre-sessional English

The Pre-sessional English course provides a short and intensive preparation in academic English for students who are already academically gualified and due to start an undergraduate or postgraduate degree programme at Queen's University Belfast in September 2016.

WHAT IS PRE-SESSIONAL **ENGLISH?**

Pre-sessional English provides high quality academic English lessons which prepare international students for academic study at Queen's University Belfast.

This course is designed to:

- improve your English language proficiency in the core skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing, within a university context
- focus on subject-related work in your chosen area of study including a written project
- help you to study independently using our extensive online materials.

WHO SHOULD APPLY FOR THIS COURSE?

This 20-hour per week course is suitable for you if you are academically qualified, hold an offer from Queen's University Belfast, and need to improve your English language level before starting an undergraduate or a postgraduate degree at Queen's University Belfast. The Pre-sessional course runs from July to early September. Your course length will vary depending on your current language level and degree programme requirements.

WHAT IS SPECIAL ABOUT **THIS COURSE?**

- Provides contextual study skills that acclimatise you to the culture of a UK university.
- Enables you to adjust to the demands, challenges and expectations of UK higher education and culture.
- Provides you with a short period of time to adapt to living and studying in the UK prior to beginning your academic studies.

ASSESSMENT AND COURSE OUTCOMES

Assuming you have already met the University's academic entry requirements and any other outstanding conditions, successful completion of the Pre-sessional English course will allow you to progress to your university course, without the requirement to retake the IELTS test.

Depending on the type of Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) you are issued, you may be required to sit end of course exams and demonstrate the minimum level of performance required by your University offer in order to progress to your main degree programme.

You will be assessed through a combination of examination and coursework during the course. Methods of assessment will include short written tests, extended essays and presentations. At the end of the course, reading, writing, speaking and listening tests will be completed.

ACCOMMODATION

University residences

Queen's residential accommodation is among the best and most modern in the UK. The University has invested over £45 million in providing excellent facilities at Elms Student Village.

The Village is in a pleasant residential area, within walking distance of both the University and the INTO Centre. What documents do I need to include?

- Completed application form, signed by the student or the parent/legal guardian.
- A copy of your university offer letter.
- Copy(ies) of English language certificate(s) in English.
- Full details of previous study in the UK.
- A copy of your passport.

What next?

After carefully reviewing the application, if successful, we will send a formal offer of a place. For complete applications, this is usually within two working days.

Once we have received the tuition fee and accommodation deposit (as detailed in the offer letter) and all the conditions of the offer have been met, we will send your Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) which is needed in order to apply for a Tier 4 (General) visa.

VISA INFORMATION

Applicants from outside the EU/EEA will need to obtain a Tier 4 (General) visa in order to study the Pre-sessional course. Queen's University Belfast will provide you with a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) which is required for your visa application. Depending on your level of English, you will receive either;

- A CAS which covers the Pre-sessional course only. You must then fulfil the conditions of your University offer in the Pre-sessional exams in order to progress to your main degree programme.
- An integrated CAS which covers both the Pre-sessional course and main degree programme but still requires you to participate in the Pre-sessional exams and fulfil the conditions of your University offer in order to progress to your main degree programme.
- An integrated CAS which covers both the Pre-sessional course and main degree programme but does not require you to participate in the Pre-sessional exams.
- Students who do not require a Tier 4 (General) visa will be required to participate in the end of course assessment and fulfil the conditions of their University offer in order to progress to their main degree programme.

The minimum requirements to be issued with an integrated CAS are outlined below. In order to qualify for an integrated CAS students must have only one English language condition outstanding on their offer letter issued by Queen's University Belfast.

MINIMUM ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS FOR INTEGRATED CAS

Students entering with an integrated CAS at this level will not be required to sit the end of course examination. Students will be required to meet minimum participation and attendance requirements.
