How counter-insurgency warfare experiences impact upon the postdeployment reintegration of land-based British army personnel

Summary

This two-year study, funded by the Forces in Mind Trust (FiMT), is designed to help improve ex-military personnel's transition to civilian life.

While previous research has investigated the experiences of armed forces who have taken part in 'conventional' forms of armed conflict, this is amongst the first to focus solely on those involved in counter-insurgency (COIN) operations. It is intended that the research findings will be used to help influence policy makers and service deliverers in their work with the reintegration of the ex-Service community back into civilian life.

The Forces in Mind Trust (FiMT) is a charity funded by the National Lottery and was established to help ex-Service men and women make a successful transition back to civilian life.
