
WHY DO A PHD AT QUEEN'S?

- Use funding code NBC24 (tick 'I will apply separately to an external body')
- Develop 750-word proposal (with supervisors) Oct-Dec 2023
- Internal competition deadline: 9 January 2024

Leverhulme Interdisciplinary Network on Algorithmic Solutions



OVERVIEW

- Two overarching themes: Artificial Intelligence, Social Justice and Public Decision-Making and Science,
 Governability and Society with suggested projects/guidance
- Each PhD student has one supervisor from AHSS Faculty and one from EEECS Faculty or Maths & Physics
- Full tuition and stipend for UK and ROI applicants; reduced fee and full stipend for other EU and non-EU applicants


APPLICATION PROCESS

- Use funding code LINASJAN24 or LINASSEP24 (tick 'I will apply separately to an external body')
- 2,000-word (max) statement addressing a project or standalone 2,000-word proposal (discuss with project leaders)
- Submission deadlines (Spring) 8 December 2023 / (Autumn) 31 January 2024
