Belfast is served by two airports: Belfast City Airport and Belfast International Airport, which are both linked to the city by regular bus services. Dublin International Airport is located approximately 100 miles to the south.

BY BOAT


Fast ferry services including Stena Line and P&O Ferries make multiple daily crossings from Northern Ireland to ports in Scotland and England, Larne to Cairnryan, Belfast to Cairnryan, Belfast to Liverpool. An alternative route runs from Holyhead to Dublin, with excellent motorway connections between there and Belfast.

BY ROAD

Queen's is located in south central Belfast and as such is close to both Northern Ireland's main motorways, connecting it easily with the rest of Ireland.

BY BUS AND TRAIN

Queen's is a five-minute walk from Botanic Train Station on the Bangor, Larne, Newry, and Derry-Londonderry lines. Belfast's new Grand Central Station is the main transport hub for Northern Ireland and is the largest of its kind on the island of Ireland. Use it as a launchpad to explore further afield, an excellent choice when used in in conjunction with the various student travel discount schemes available. A newly launched hourly Enterprise train service to Dublin makes it easier than ever to travel to and from Ireland's capital.



FACULTY OF ARTS, HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

The faculty brings together subjects that shape how we understand the world and influence real change in society, culture, education, business and law.

Its programmes combine academic rigour with real-world relevance, preparing students for global careers across a wide range of industries.

It has five faculty schools: Queen's Business School; Law; Social Sciences, Education and Social Work: Arts, English and Languages; and History, Anthropology, Philosophy and Politics.

FACULTY OF ENGINEERING AND PHYSICAL SCIENCES

Spanning disciplines at the forefront of innovation, the Faculty of Engineering and Physical Sciences is delivering solutions to global challenges through cutting-edge research and industry-informed teaching.

From Al. robotics and advanced manufacturing to clean energy, and health technologies, we're developing the knowledge, tools, and skills to shape a smarter, more sustainable future.

It has six faculty schools: Chemistry and Chemical Engineering; Electronics and Electrical Engineering; Mathematics and Physics; Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering; Natural and Built Environment; and Psychology.





BACCALAUREATE

Queen's welcomes applications from International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma students.

Offers will normally be conditional upon successful completion of the IB, to include three subjects at Higher Level (with scores between 6,6,6,-5,5,5), in addition to an overall score (normally between 29 and 36 points). Points obtained for the Extended Essay and Theory of Knowledge can count towards the total.

The table to the right shows the IB requirements compared to the University's UK A-level entry requirements. We may also require specific grades in relevant Higher Level subjects. Details of the A-level grades and any specific subject requirements for each programme may be found in our Course Finder at: qub.ac.uk/courses/



ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should also hold an acceptable English language qualification at the appropriate level. English (Syllabus A) with a score of 5 at Standard Level or 5 at Higher Level will normally meet the English language entry requirement for the majority of our programmes. English (Syllabus B) with a score of 7 at Standard Level. or 5 or 6 at Higher Level is also acceptable. However, please note that English language requirements may vary depending on your chosen programme. Please refer to our Course Finder for English language requirements by programme.

Applicants who are not studying English as part of the International Baccalaureate Diploma should refer to the full list of other acceptable English language requirements.





HOW TO APPLY

Applications for admission to full-time undergraduate and sandwich courses at the university should normally be made through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). Full information can be obtained from the UCAS website at: ucas.com/apply.

WHEN TO APPLY

UCAS will start processing applications for entry in autumn 2026 from 1 September 2025.

The UCAS Equal Consideration Deadline for the receipt of applications for entry in 2026 is Wednesday 14 January (18:00) 2026. However, for applicants applying to Oxford or Cambridge and for those whose choices include Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary Medicine/Science the closing date is Wednesday 15 October (18:00) 2025.

There are two intakes for Professional Nursing in Adult and Children and Young People's (one in September and the other in February). Application for these courses must be made by the UCAS Equal Consideration Deadline on Wednesday 14 January 2026 deadline (18:00) prior to the academic year of entry i.e. for September and the following February.

Applicants are encouraged to apply as early as is consistent with having made a careful and considered choice of institutions and courses. Earlier applicants normally receive decisions more quickly. however, UCAS accepts that some applicants, especially those from outside the UK, may find this difficult. Late applications are, in practice, accepted by UCAS throughout the remainder of the application cycle, but you should understand that they are considered by institutions at their discretion, and there can be no guarantee that they will be given the same full level of consideration as applications received by the advisory closing date.

Applications for Nursing, Midwifery and Social Work must be submitted by the 14 January 2026 deadline (18:00). Applications received after this deadline will not be considered. Take care to enter the details of the institutions and courses clearly and correctly on the application. For Queen's, the institution code name is QBELF and the institution code is Q75. These should be entered in the Choices section of your UCAS application. Please note a Campus Code is not required.
