MASTERCLASSES AND WORKSHOPS

How to prepare for a presentation at interview Monday 22 July, 11.00 am - 1.00 pm

This workshop will provide you with guidance on how to prepare and deliver a presentation for a job interview or assessment centre as part of the recruitment process.

How to write your CV Monday 29 July, 11.00 am - 1.00 pm

Ensure your CV is market-ready for non-academic job applications. This workshop will provide you with guidance on how to profile yourself on paper, whether you are just starting your CV or want to revamp it.

How to answer competency based questions on application forms or at interview Monday 29 July, 2.00 pm - 4.00 pm

This workshop will provide you with examples of competency based questions which are often used as part of the recruitment process. You will have the opportunity to learn a strategy to answer questions and practise your technique.
