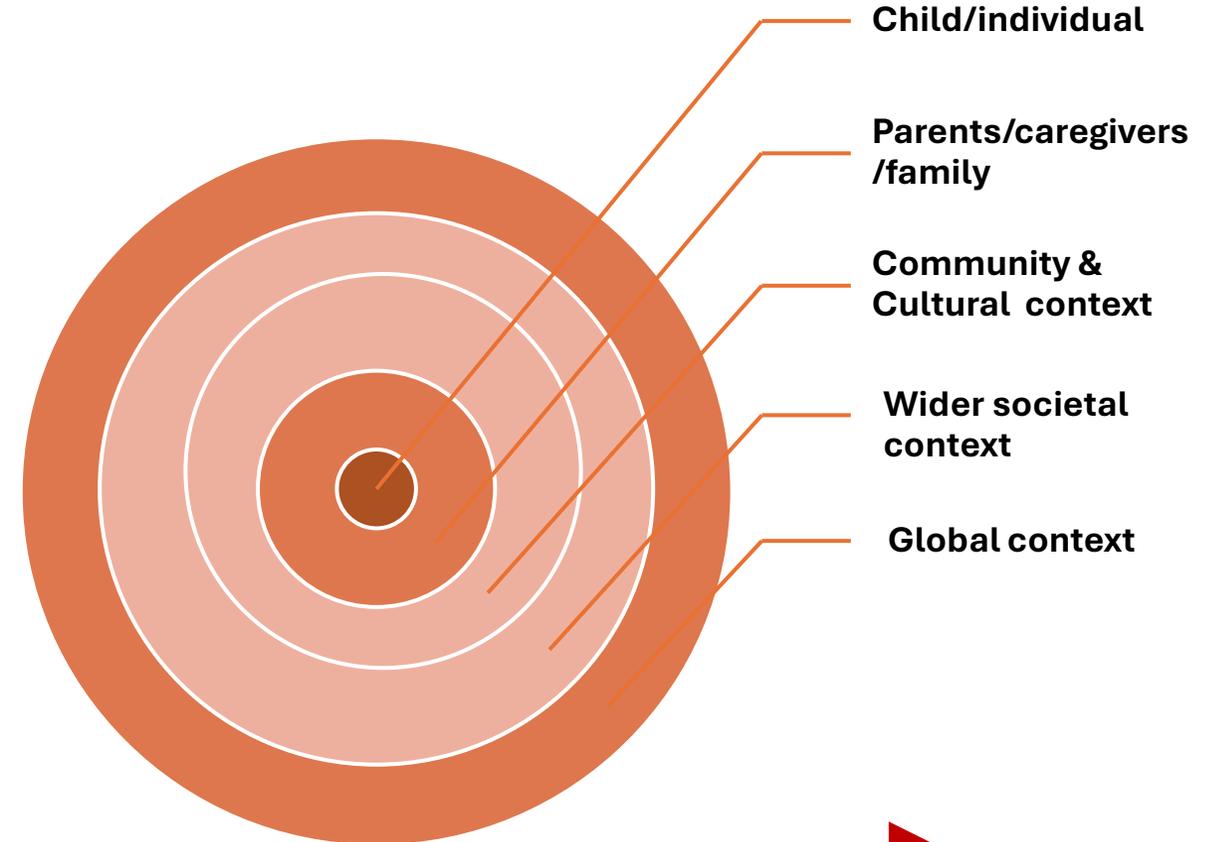

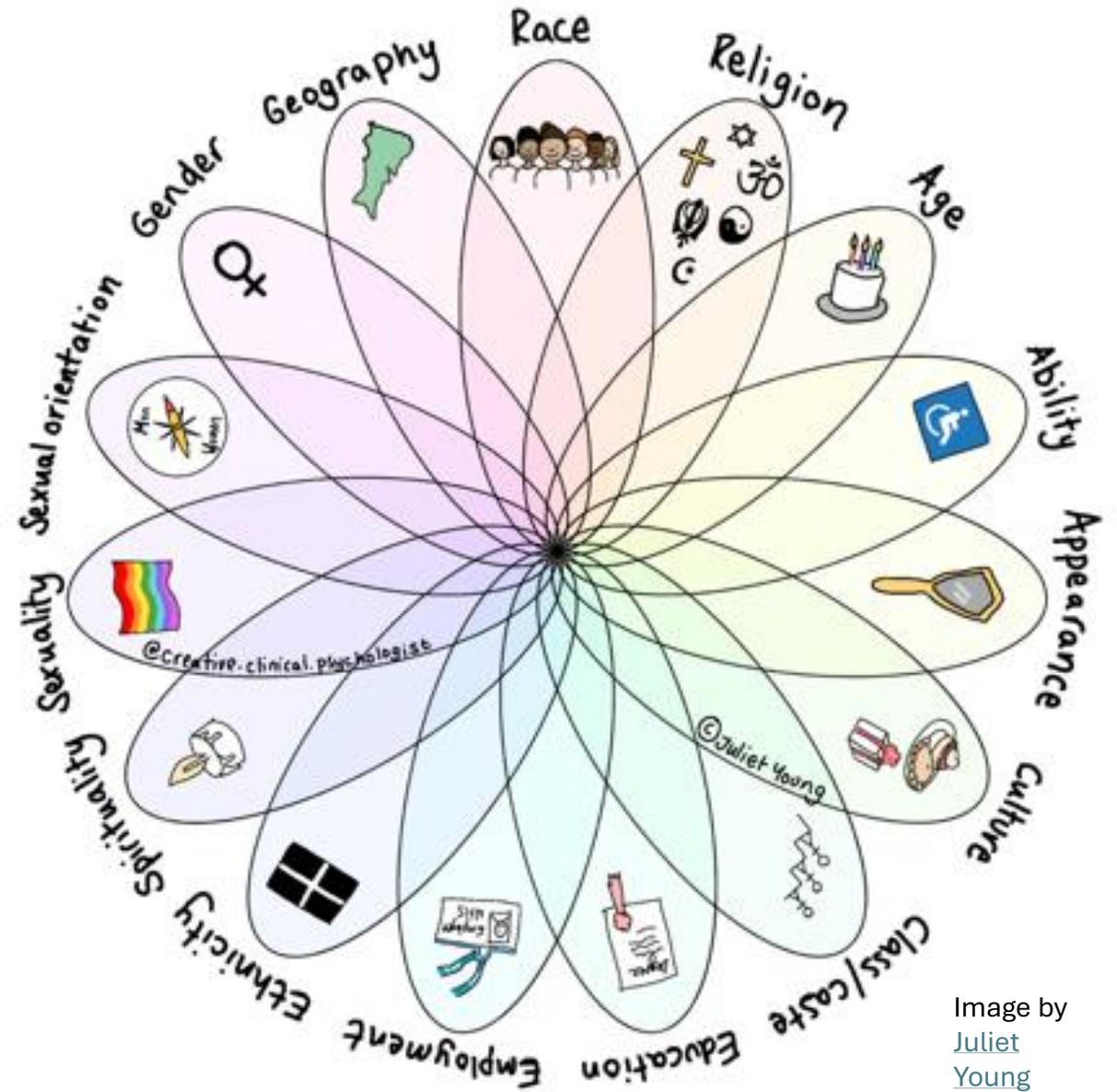

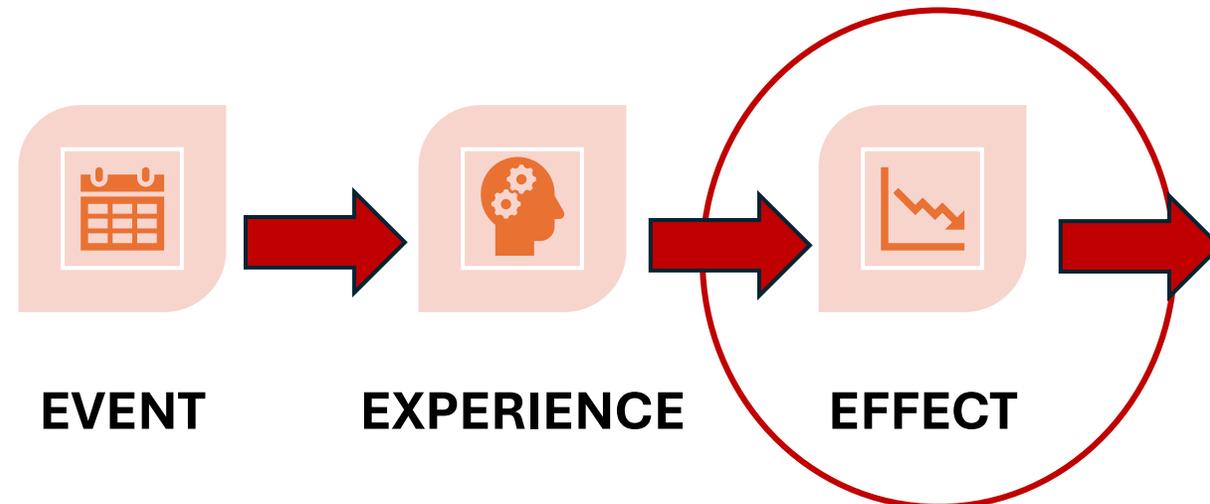

## Trauma is a wound

“It’s not what happened to you  
(**the traumatic episode**)...

... it’s the wound that happens  
inside of you (as a result of  
**what happened to you**)...”



# Traumatic experiences...



...are very stressful, frightening or distressing events that are difficult to cope with or **out of our control**.

... **threaten or violate** one's **safety, health, security, trust and bodily integrity**.

... may be **directly experienced or witnessed – physical or emotional**

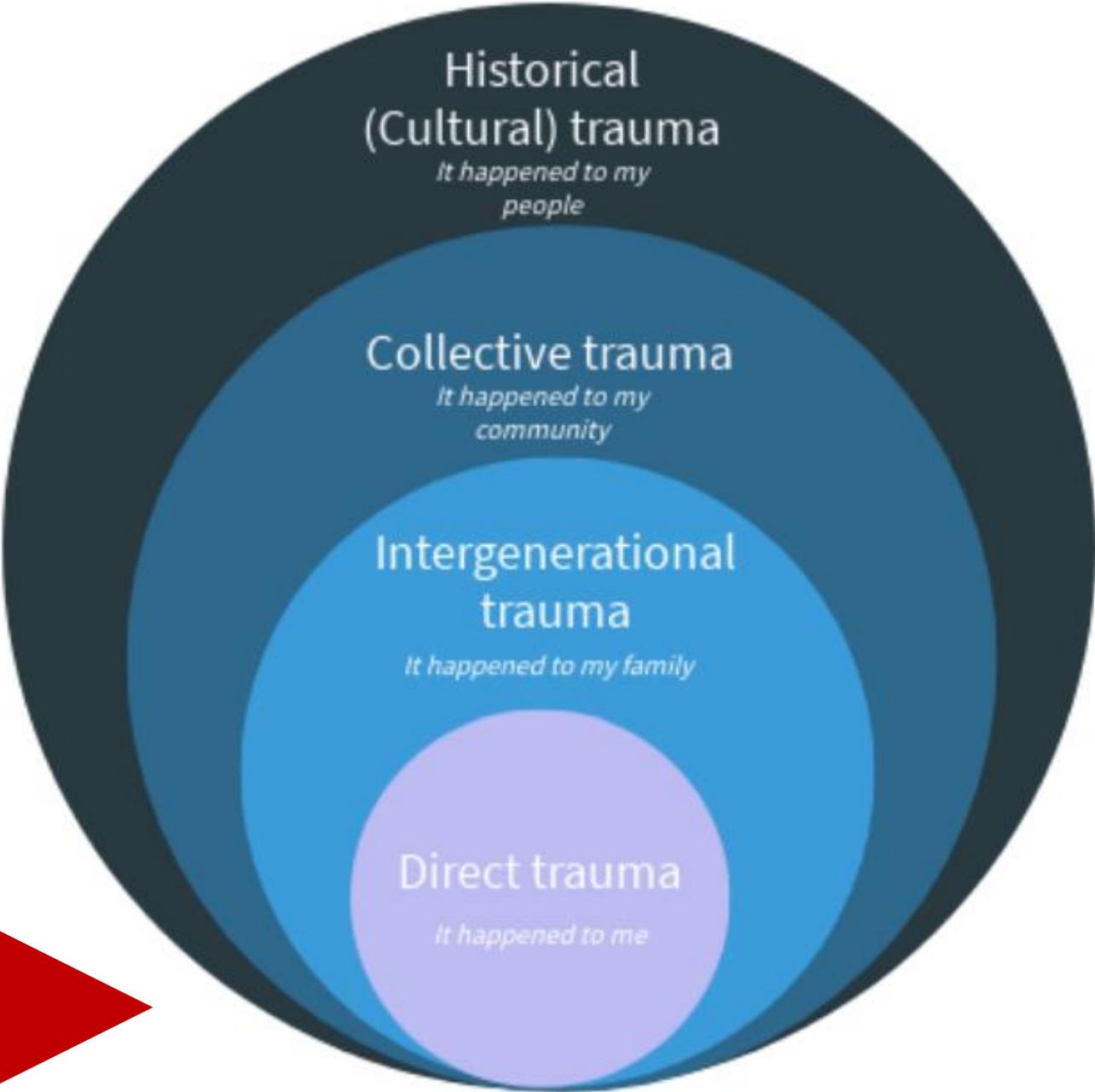
... can happen **at any age**. They can affect us **at any time**, including a long time after the event.

... **are common – the significance of multiple adverse experiences**

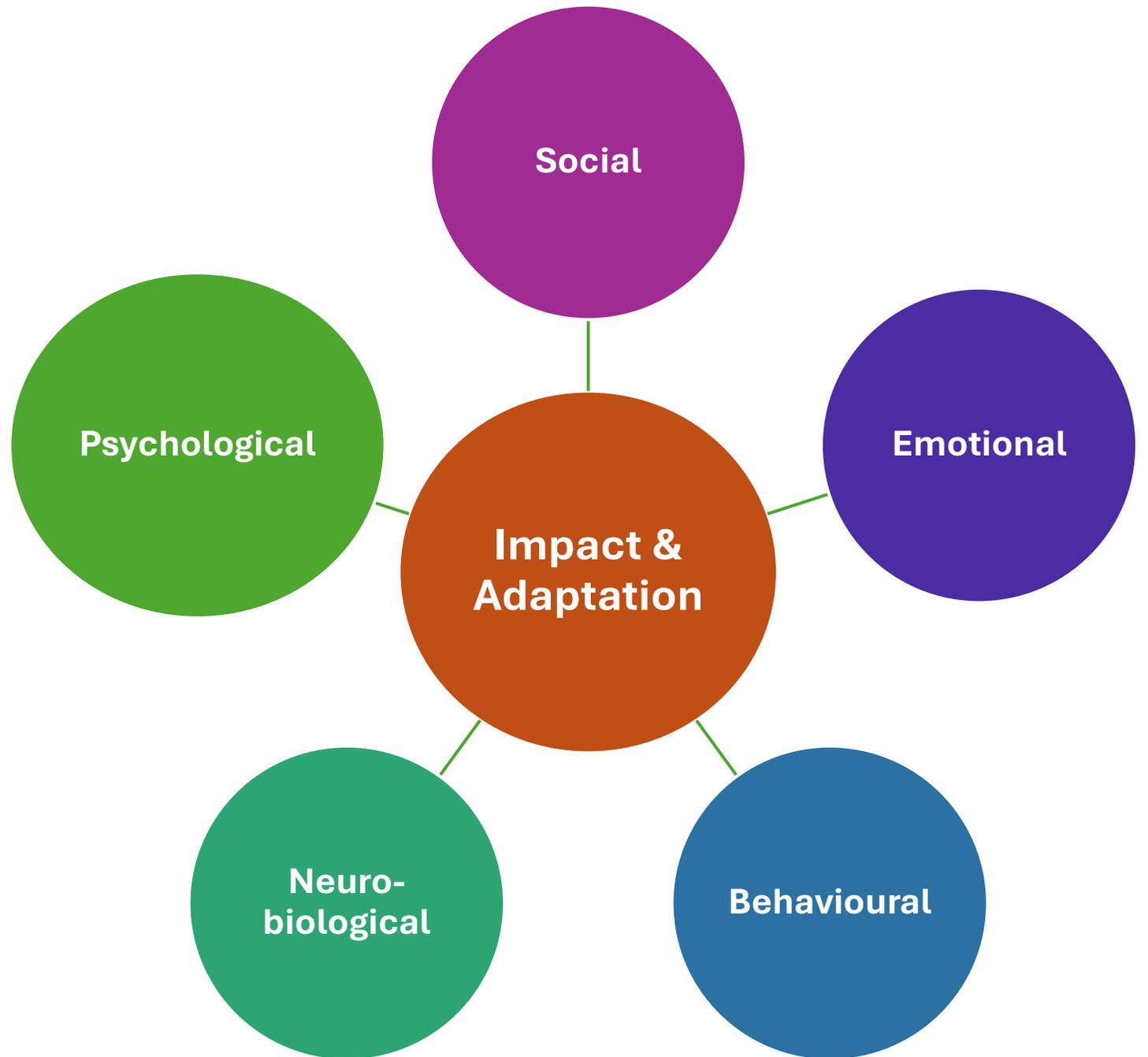
**Acute**

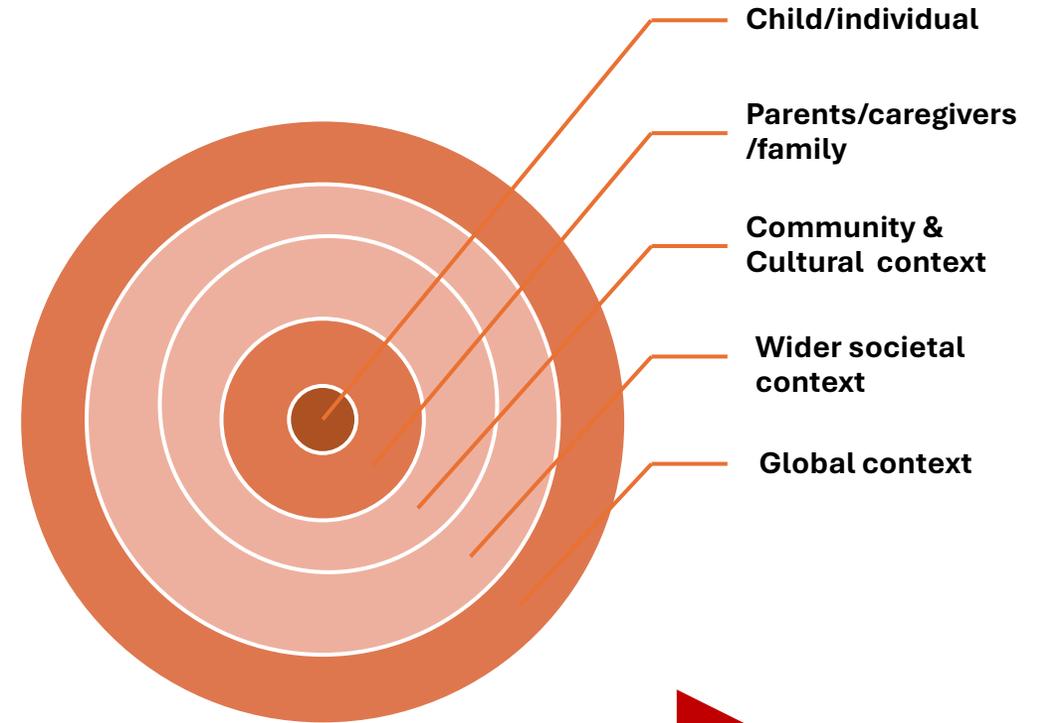
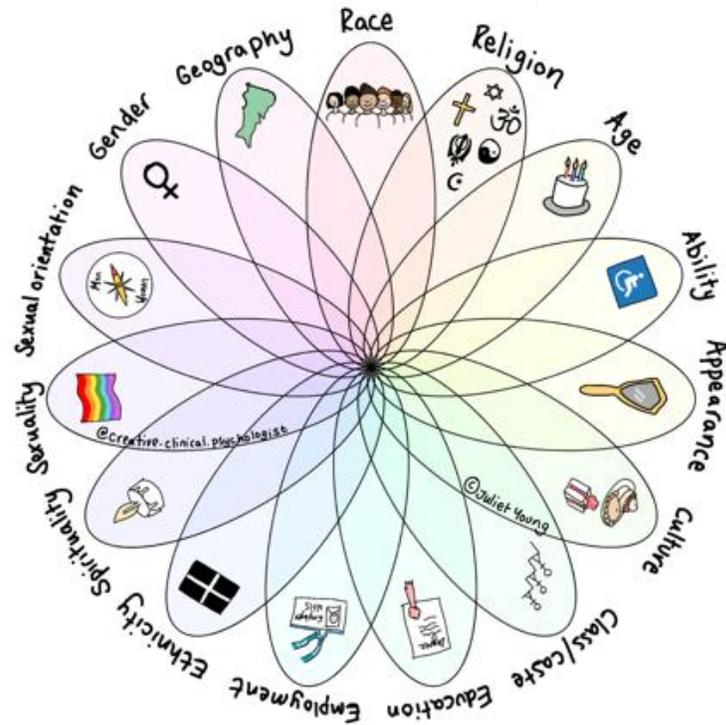

# Hope

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**Most trauma symptoms are protective** (i.e. They help us survive)

There is a **process of natural recovery** (once a form of safety has been established) during which the adverse experiences may become integrated into the person's life history

The typical pattern for even the most catastrophic experiences is **resolution of symptoms with time** and not the development of PTSD – and some may need more specialist support

# The Power of Positive Experiences

## Benevolent/Positive Childhood Experiences

(Narayan et al., 2018)

characterised by safety and security, positive self-perceptions and social support – help protect from harm

*'one caregiver  
you felt safe with'*

*'one teacher who cared'*

*'an adult who could provide  
you with support & advice'*

*'predictable home routine, like  
regular meals & bedtime'*

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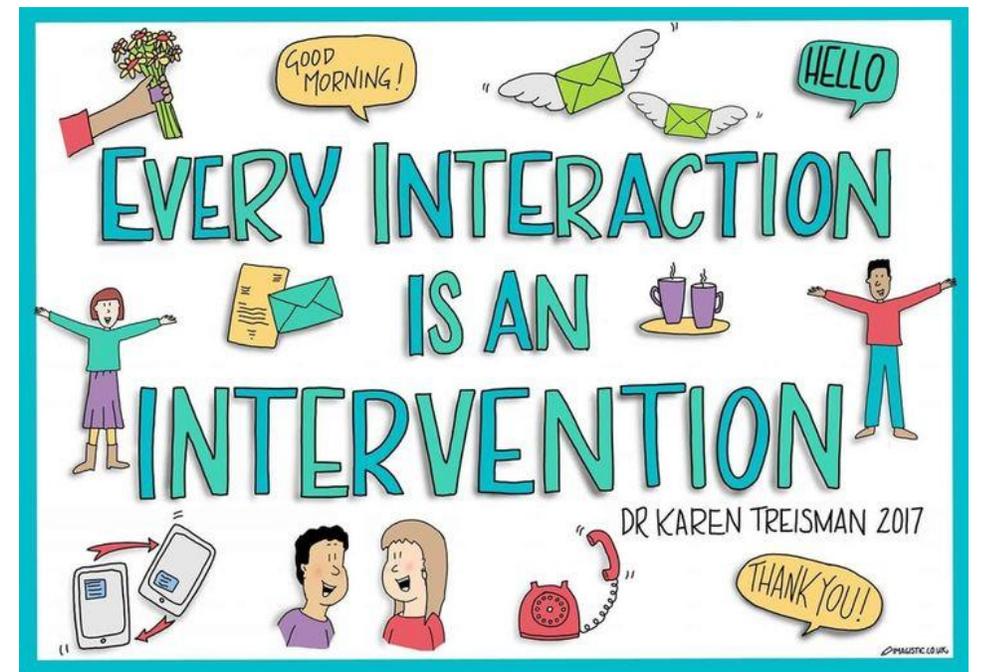
**"Being able to feel safe with other people is probably the single most important aspect of mental health;**
