The MOSAICC study wants to determine why some people develop Myeloproliferative Neoplasms (MPNs) including PV, ET and MF. These occur when there is an over production of red/white blood cells or platelets but their causes remain unknown. The study will also identify the quality of life of people living with a MPN in order to help improve the lives of people living with these conditions.

If you are aged over 18 years, have been diagnosed with one of these conditions and would like to help us with this important study you would be asked to:

- Complete a telephone interview and questionnaire about occupation, lifestyle and your quality of life.

Choose to provide **any** or **all** of the following;

- A blood sample
- A saliva sample
- Toe-nail clippings

Speak to your consultant about this study to see if you are eligible to take part. The study is being led by researchers at the University of Aberdeen, Scotland and Queen's University Belfast, Northern Ireland. The project is funded by the charities: **MPN Voice** and **Leukaemia & Lymphoma NI**.
