  Accelerator Network. The CRUK Accelerator partnership includes (Belfast, Southampton, UCL-Neuropathology ICR/Marsden, Manchester, Leicester, Newcastle and Edinburgh).
- One Belfast Health and Social Care training fellowship (fees and salary)\* open to applicants who are employed in the Belfast Trust, priority will be given to those based in a relevant laboratory environment whereby upskilling to support the transformation of Genomic Medicine in Northern Ireland is essential. \*Salary agreed at Band 6.

Short Curriculum Vitae, with particular focus on your research experience (1 A4 page max)

Declaration of interest as to your motivation for being a MSc student in Molecular Pathology (1 A4 page – 500 words max)
