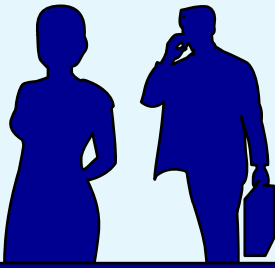


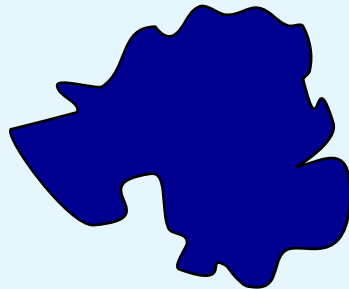
Social Deprivation

How is it related to cancer?

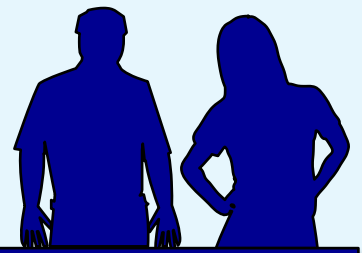
Social deprivation is a measure of a person's ability to access things like healthy food, quality housing, education, healthcare, fuel, and clothing. The population of Northern Ireland is divided into five deprivation 'quintiles' based on area of residence.



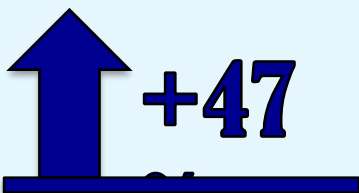
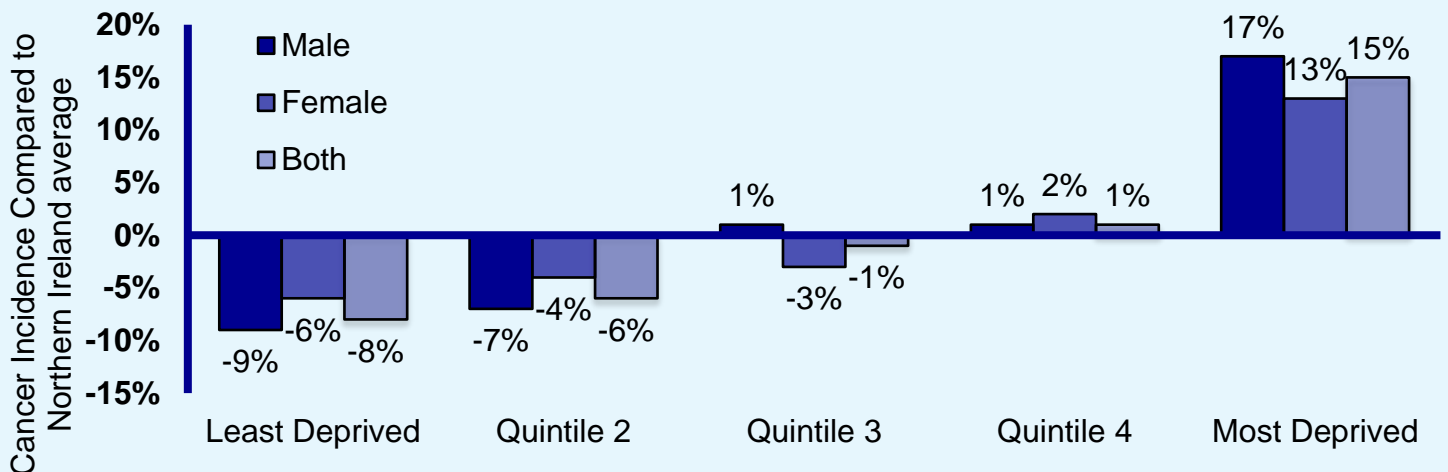
Cancer incidence is 8% below NI average in the least deprived communities



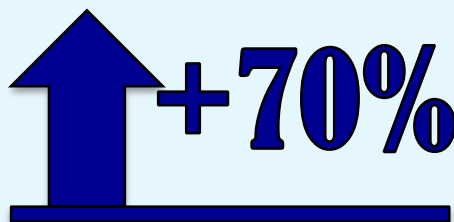
Some geographic variation in cancer incidence is due to a relationship between cancer and socioeconomic deprivation



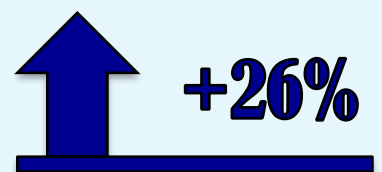
Cancer incidence is 15% above NI average in the most deprived communities



Incidence of cervical cancer is 47% above average in the most deprived communities



Incidence of lung cancer is 70% above average in the most deprived communities



Incidence of bladder cancer is 26% above average in the most deprived communities
