Conclusion	This national study explored the impact of deprivation and rurality on self-reported healthrelated quality of life (HRQL) following prostate cancer <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The impact of deprivation and rurality on HRQL was not greater than would be expected in the general population • Some functional prostate specific outcomes were affected by deprivation
What this means for the service	No clinically meaningful differences in HRQL were identified by rurality of residence
