Utilising recent research findings, and the ongoing monitoring experiences of CCNI, this conference will provide an insight into the impact of recent changes in charity accounting, reporting and regulation with respect to Northern Ireland charities. In particular it will:

- Focus on the experiences of CCNI from the first round of monitoring (completed very recently);
- Examine the performance and impact reporting requirements of the most recent Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) for charities; and
- Reflect on major UK-wide changes in relation to fundraising.

Presenters and contributors include: Professor Andrew Hind CB (Cass Business School – former Chief Executive of the Charity Commission for England and Wales and former Chair of the Fundraising Standards Board); Frances McCandless (Chief Executive, CCNI); Myles McKeown (Head of Compliance and Enquiries, CCNI); and Professors Ciaran Connolly and Noel Hyndman, and Dr Mariann Liguori (Queen's Management School). In addition, Chartered Accountants Ireland will provide a short overview of a new book 'Charity Accounting and Reporting at a Time of Change' (published by them and written by the three Queen's presenters).
