

- Time: 12.30 (there will be lunch!!)







Thursday 12th September

 - Ask about adding a second language to your degree pathway.




What have former

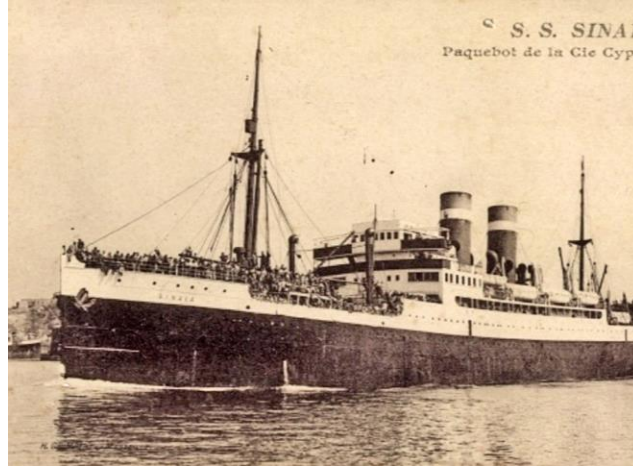
Congratulations!

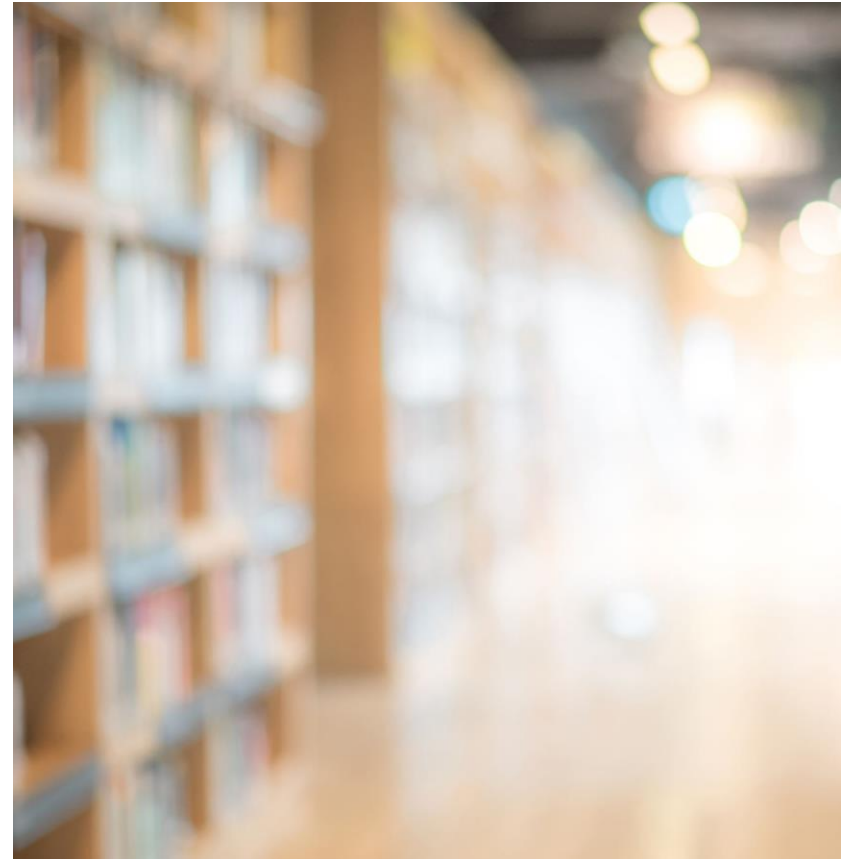

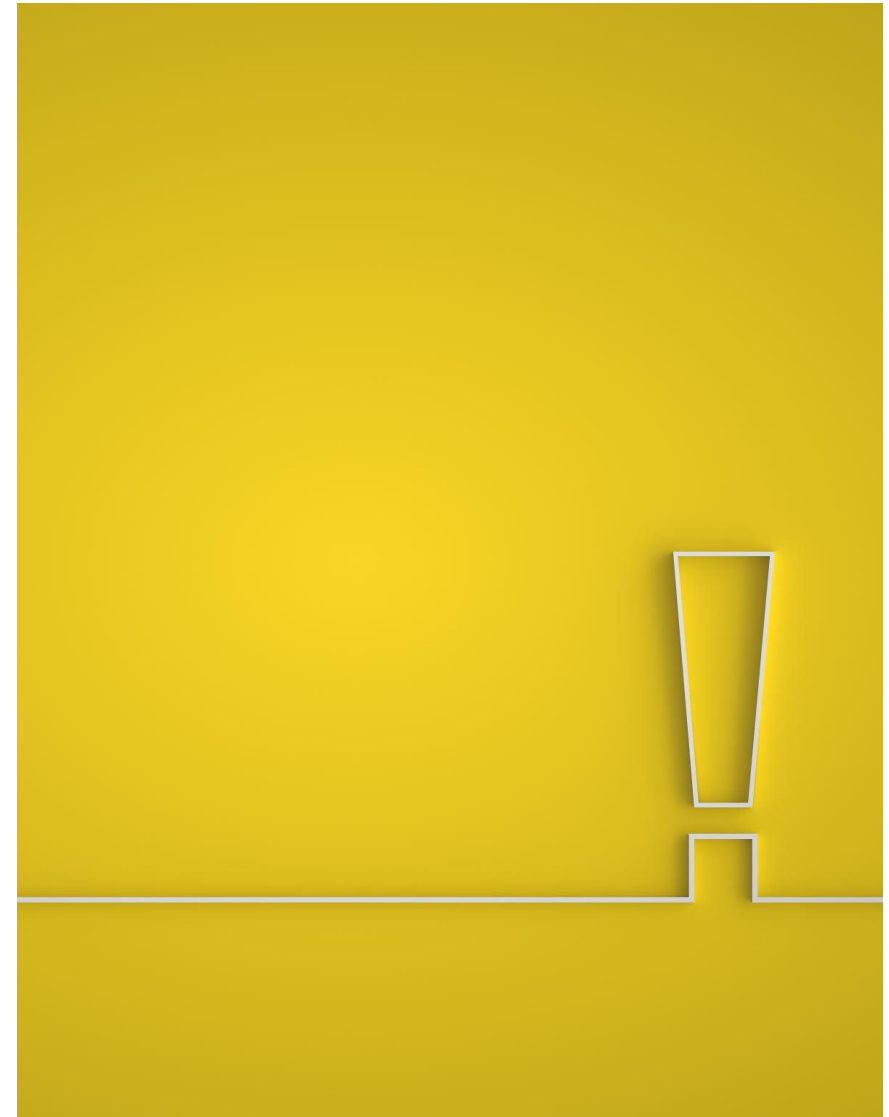

Dates for your diary

- The first day of teachign in semester 1 **is Monday 16th September** (Week 1). The last day of semester is **Friday 13th December** (week 13).
- Week 6 (21st October) for all modules in languages is Independent Study Week or *Reading Week*: no classes are scheduled this week, to allow you to prepare assessments due in weeks 7 and 8.
- Weeks 12 and 13 are used for assessments.
- The University closes for Christmas: **Monday 23rd December 2024 to Wednesday 1st January 2025 (inclusive)**

A few facts and figures

- Your first year counts as 10% of your final degree.
- A typical student in Modern Languages can expect to have 10-12 contact hours per week.
- You should expect to spend 31-40 hours per week studying. That equates to about 12 hours per module.
- The University considers **10-15 hours per week to be the maximum** a student can spend at a part time job. If you are working more hours than this, you will struggle to meet university expectations and may not complete your degree.
