From rooftop terraces like Café Parisien or the river views of Cutters Wharf to the piazza at St Anne's Square in Cathedral Quarter which houses a selection of great eateries to make the most of a sunny day.



Pack a Picnic

The Big Fish, overlooking the River Lagan at Donegall Quay, is a 10m long sculpture made up of ceramic tiles that tell the story and history of Belfast. It offers a great photo opportunity where you can pose next to the fish, pretend to catch the fish, have a fish selfie or give the fish a kiss to gain its wisdom.





Have a wheelie good time It's the best time of year to take a bike tour around Belfast and discover a range of attractions and interesting points along the way, or create your own itinerary and hire a Belfast Bike from one of 40 docking stations located across the city centre.



Discover some Urban Art The vibrant Cathedral Quarter is not only packed full of great live music bars and tasty modern restaurants but also offers a distinctly varied and modern street art scene. Take some time to stroll around the area to view these amazing pieces of art and don't miss the fabulous ceiling of colourful umbrellas in the allev off Commercial Court. which contains a mural of some of Belfast's most famous faces.

Exploring a city can be tricky if you don't know your way around, or even what to look out for. Get a flavour of Belfast with this taster to help navigate your way around the city's areas and quarters.



CITY CENTRE

Home to the iconic Belfast City Hall, St George's Market and the main shopping district. You'll be spoilt for choice with the abundance of cool cafés, great pubs, trendy bars and an amazing restaurant scene. Start off in the Visit Belfast Welcome Centre (opposite City Hall) to pick up information, book tours and find out everything to make the most of vour visit



CATHEDRAL QUARTER

Packed full of fascinating architecture, buzzing beer gardens, trendy warehouse restaurants, cobblestoned streets, and colourful street art, this area of town is absolutely buzzing at night. It contrasts the old with the new, with St. Anne's Square, home to the Metropolitan Arts Centre (MAC) and a piazza of welcoming eateries, alongside some of the oldest streets in Belfast.



LINEN QUARTER

Belfast was once nicknamed "Linenopolis" as it was the world leader in the production of linen in the 19th Century. Just south of City Hall, you can enjoy the architecture of the old linen mills which house a mix of offices, chic bars and renowned restaurants. This is a great part of town to enjoy dinner and drinks before an entertaining show at the Grand Opera House.



TITANIC QUARTER

Steeped in memories of a bygone era, the Titanic Quarter is now a fun and energetic urban waterfront development. Visit or take a tour of the many historic and state-of-the-art Titanic visitor attractions, be wowed by science in W5, explore the 100 year old history of HMS Caroline or catch a show, concert or Ice Hockey game at the SSE Arena.



QUEEN'S QUARTER

The area around Queen's University is a treasure trove of eclectic shops, boutiques, cafés, bars and art galleries. Visit the collections of the Ulster Museum, stroll around Botanic Gardens or enjoy great live music or comedy at the Empire Music Hall. The neighbouring Lisburn Road offers designer shopping, cafés, artisan delis, salons and wine bars.



GAELTACHT QUARTER

The centre for Irish language, music and culture is in the west of the city. An Cultúrann showcases cultural Irish Gaelic traditions and contains a restaurant, gift shop, theatre and gallery. Explore the stunning Clonard Monastery or enjoy the 3 mile Divis Summit Trail, a specifically designed loop walk on Divis Mountain with spectacular views over Belfast.



EAST SIDE

EastSide was once the beating heart of the city's industrial past with thousands of people employed in linen mills, rope factories, engineering works and shipyards. EastSide is now thriving once again but this time as a hub of culture and creativity. Make the EastSide Visitor Centre your first stop, with information on key attractions in east Belfast.



THE SHANKILL

Straddling North and West Belfast. the Shankill is home to a wide collection of painted murals depicting the social and political history of the area. Places of interest include the Peace Wall, the Old Shankill Graveyard, dating back to the 14th century, the Shankill Memorial Park and the ancient Bullaun Stone. The Spectrum Centre, a major landmark in the area, hosts a range of events and exhibitions.

Over four hundred years have passed since the first settlers made Belfast their home: public buildings, museums and visitor centres will let you discover the city's rich history and heritage.



The James Connolly Visitor Centre 🞯

(Áras Uí Chonghaile) is an inspirational new attraction telling the story of Connolly, exploring his role as a pioneer of the early trade union movement. and his travels throughout Britain and America. Learn of his key role in the Faster Rising, his subsequent court-martial, death sentence and execution. The centre offers a thought provoking insight into his life, his politics and the impact he had on the history of the island of Ireland. arasuichonghaile.com

The Museum of Orange

Heritage (2) focuses on the history and traditions of the Orange Institution, beginning with the Glorious Revolution, and travels right through until the present day. There's also a strong focus on Orangeism around the world with a fascinating collection of artefacts. orangeheritage.co.uk



For those with an interest in Ulster-Scots connections, visit the **Discover Ulster Scots Centre** on Gordon Street where you can discover thousands of years of history, from the formation of the Giant's Causeway (which links County Antrim with the Western Isles of Scotland) right up to the present day. **discoverulster scots.com**



Based in a former Presbyterian church, **Cultúrlann McAdam Ó** Fiaich (18) is an arts and cultural centre with a strong focus on Irish language and culture. The interactive space on the 1st floor, provides an insight into the development of Irish language and culture in Belfast and on how Irish has influenced English. culturlann.ie

Cutters Wharf

What better place to enjoy the sun than a lazy day down by the river? This scenic spot sits on the banks of the River Lagan and always has a buzzing atmosphere. It's the perfect space for relaxing and enjoying delicious food, cocktails and barbecues throughout the summer months. cutterswharf.co.uk

Belfast City Hall & Titanic Memorial Garden

Free tours are available of Belfast's most iconic building (1906). Outside, the Titanic Memorial Garden contains plaques listing the names of the 1,512 people who perished on RMS Titanic.

Ulster Museum

Impressive galleries and interactive discovery zones bring history, science and art collections to life for visitors of all ages, with free admission to all visitors.

The Dome at Victoria Square

Boasting 360° views across the city, don't miss taking the lift to the top of this stunning shopping destination.

Linenhall Library

The city's oldest library (1788) houses one of the most renowned collections of Irish material in the world. Browse the collections, visit the gift shop or relax in the coffee shop.



Cultúrlann McAdam Ó Fiaich

Discover a varied programme of Irish language and cultural events as well as a café/ restaurant, bookshop, art gallery and visitor information.

St George's Market

Ulster Museum Botanic Gardens

A treasure house of the past and the present, the Ulster Museum is home to a rich collection of art, history and natural sciences. On the fringes of the Cathedral Quarter stands this red brick building whose ground floor houses one of Belfast's coolest art galleries. The stark concrete interior lends itself perfectly to changing exhibitions of paintings, photography and installations. goldenthreadgallery.co.uk

Space Craft A7 Fountain Centre

A lovely combination of shop and gallery, showcasing a range of ceramics, jewellery, sculptures, design items, fabrics, cards and art by local makers. The crafts exhibited change constantly and also showcase work by young, emerging artists. Scarefit-ni

War Memorial Gallery Talbot Street

A must see attraction for visitors with an interest in the Home Front and US Forces in Northern Ireland during the Second World War. The exhibition recalls the contribution of the Home Front, the Belfast blitz of 1941 and the presence of US forces from 1942 to 1944. S **niwarmemorial.org**

Discover Ulster Scots 1–9 Victoria Street

This spacious exhibition gallery is packed with stories of the close connections between Ulster and Scotland embedded in thousands of years of history, from the formation of the Giant's



Causeway right up to the present day. Find out which heritage trails will lead you down the path to your ancestors. discoverulsterscots.com

ArtisAnn Gallery 70 Bloomfield Avenue

Based over two floors, the gallery features an array of artworks by both emerging and established artists, from painters and sculptors to photographers and collagemakers. The exhibition space hosts a new show each month with all showcased work for sale.

Gerard Dillon Gallery Cultúrlann McAdam Ó Fiaich, 216 Falls Road

The gallery is dedicated to Gerard Dillon RHA RUA 1916-1971, an artist from the Falls Road area of Belfast who earned worldwide fame. The gallery focuses on work from professional artists and generally hosts eight exhibitions per year. Sculturlann.ie

The Naughton Gallery Lanyon Building, Queen's University

One of Belfast's most vibrant and exciting art galleries, featuring a rolling programme of works from Queen's own collection, touring exhibitions and shows by local and international artists. naughtongallery.org

Atypical Gallery 109-113 Royal Avenue

Atypical Gallery is the only permanent exhibition space on the island of Ireland dedicated specifically to highlighting the work of disabled and deaf artists. It provides a welcoming, accessible environment for both emerging and established artists practising across the visual arts spectrum. (a) adf.ie

Museum of Orange Heritage 368 Cregagh Road

Located in the EastSide, this museum offers a fantastic and interactive visitor experience learning about the Orange culture. From formal, manicured flowerbeds to sprawling meadows and woods, there are some fantastic places to be enjoyed, so this summer pack a picnic and explore one of our beautiful parks or gardens.

Belfast Botanic Gardens and Palm House (9)

This public park contains an extensive rose garden, long herbaceous borders and rare oaks. The Palm House (1852) contains a range of tropical plants, hanging baskets, seasonal displays and birds of paradise, and is a masterpiece of moulded glass and wrought iron.

Barnett Demesne

Home to Malone House, an elegant mansion dating back to the 1820's, which commands stunning views over acres of magnificent parkland, Lagan Valley and the Belfast Hills. Barnett Demesne is also home to an arboretum. daffodil garden and a number of woodland and wildflower meadows. Enjoy walks linking to the adiacent Lagan Towpath.

Ormeau Park

Not far from the River Lagan, this is the oldest municipal park in the city. Popular with walkers and joggers, with a range of eco trails and orienteering routes as well as a children's playground. There are also a range of sports facilities on offer including soccer pitches, bowling greens, a BMX track, and basketball, tennis and netball courts.

Sir Thomas and Lady Dixon Park @2

The International Rose Garden at Sir Thomas and Lady Dixon Park is amonast the best in the world. From July to September over 45.000 roses are in bloom.
