

LEONARDO DA VINCI: A LIFE IN DRAWING

1 February – 6 May Ulster Museum

To mark the 500th anniversary of the death of Leonardo da Vinci, 144 of the Renaissance master's greatest drawings in the Royal Collection will go on display in 12 simultaneous exhibitions across the UK. The Ulster Museum's exhibition will include two of Leonardo's most famous works - The Head of St Anne, made around 1510 in preparation for his famous masterpiece The Virgin and Child with St Anne, which hangs in the Louvre, and an anatomical drawing from 1489. The Skull Sectioned. Visitors will also be able to view examples of all the drawing materials employed by the artist. nmni.com/um

TIM PEAKE SPACECRAFT AND VR DESCENT EXPERIENCE

20 February – 12 May Ulster Folk and Transport Museum

On 15 December 2015. British astronaut Tim Peake embarked on the Principia mission to the International Space Station, where he spent six months orbiting Earth. On 18 June 2016. Tim returned to Earth in the Sovuz TMA-19M descent module, which will land at the Ulster Transport Museum this spring. The display of the iconic craft will be accompanied by Space Descent VR, a unique virtual reality adventure narrated by Tim Peake himself. 

Exploring a city can be tricky if you don't know your way around, or even what to look out for. Get a flavour of Belfast with this taster to help navigate your way around the city's areas and quarters.



CITY CENTRE

Home to the iconic Belfast City Hall, St George's Market and the main shopping district. You'll be spoilt for choice with the abundance of cool cafés, great pubs, trendy bars and an amazing restaurant scene. Start off in the Visit Belfast Welcome Centre (opposite City Hall) to pick up information, book tours and find out everything to make the most of vour visit



CATHEDRAL QUARTER

Packed full of fascinating architecture, buzzing beer gardens, trendy warehouse restaurants, cobblestoned streets, and colourful street art, this area of town is absolutely buzzing at night. It contrasts the old with the new, with St. Anne's Square, home to the Metropolitan Arts Centre (MAC) and a piazza of welcoming eateries, alongside some of the oldest streets in Belfast.



LINEN QUARTER

Belfast was once nicknamed "Linenopolis" as it was the world leader in the production of linen in the 19th Century. Just south of City Hall, you can enjoy the architecture of the old linen mills which house a mix of offices, chic bars and renowned restaurants. This is a great part of town to enjoy dinner and drinks before an entertaining show at the Grand Opera House.



TITANIC OUARTER

Steeped in memories of a bygone era, the Titanic Quarter is now a fun and energetic urban waterfront development. Visit or take a tour of the many historic and state-of-the-art Titanic visitor attractions, be wowed by science in W5, explore the 100 year old history of HMS Caroline or catch a show, concert or Ice Hockey game at the SSE Arena.



QUEEN'S QUARTER

The area around Queen's University is a treasure trove of eclectic shops, boutiques, cafés, bars and art galleries. Visit the collections of the Ulster Museum, stroll around Botanic Gardens or enjoy great live music or comedy at the Empire Music Hall. The neighbouring Lisburn Road offers designer shopping, cafés, artisan delis, salons and wine bars.



GAELTACHT QUARTER

The centre for Irish language, music and culture is in the west of the city. An Cultúrann showcases cultural Irish Gaelic traditions and contains a restaurant, gift shop, theatre and gallery. Explore the stunning Clonard Monastery or enjoy the 3 mile Divis Summit Trail, a specifically designed loop walk on Divis Mountain with spectacular views over Belfast.



ACHT EAST SIDE

EastSide was once the beating heart of the city's industrial past with thousands of people employed in linen mills, rope factories, engineering works and shipyards. EastSide is now thriving once again but this time as a hub of culture and creativity. Make the EastSide Visitor Centre your first stop, with information on key attractions in east Belfast.



THE SHANKILL

Straddling North and West Belfast. the Shankill is home to a wide collection of painted murals depicting the social and political history of the area. Places of interest include the Peace Wall, the Old Shankill Graveyard, dating back to the 14th century, the Shankill Memorial Park and the ancient Bullaun Stone. The Spectrum Centre, a major landmark in the area, hosts a range of events and exhibitions.

From parks blooming with colour to peaceful canal side towpaths and the hills that surround the city providing breath-taking views, there really is something for everyone when it comes to exploring Belfast on foot or by bike. Add a different element to your city visit and get out and view Belfast from a completely different angle!

PUT A SPRING IN YOUR STEP



Gruffalo Trail at Colin Glen Forest

A perfect stroll with younger children, join the very clever mouse, follow in his footsteps and meet the silly old fox, owl and snake on the way to an amazing 8 foot tall Gruffalo, complete with nobbly knees, turned out toes and a poisonous wart on the end of his nose! The 1.2 mile trail is completely free so bring the family and 'take a stroll through the deep dark woods' to enjoy one of Belfast's most beautiful parks. Look out too for the new Stick Man trail with characters to help children explore the natural world and learn how things grow.

Botanic Gardens

Botanic Gardens was established in 1828 by the Belfast Botanic and Horticultural Society, Originally known as the Belfast Botanic Garden. The site contained exotic tree species and impressive plant collections from the southern hemisphere. many of which can still be seen in the park. It's also home to the Palm House and Tropical Ravine. The Trail Route is a 0.8 mile circular walk that can be started from any of the entrances to the gardens.

Sir Thomas & Lady Dixon Park

Located in south Belfast, this popular park is home to the City of Belfast International Rose Garden, which attracts thousands of visitors to the Rose Week celebrations every July, Covering more than 128 acres. the park is made up of rolling meadows. copses and woodland as well as containing international camellia trails, a walled garden. a Japanese-style garden with water feature for quiet contemplation and a children's playaround. The 2.5 mile circular walk starts from the lower carpark.

Minnowburn & Giants Ring

This relaxing 3 mile walk starts and ends. at the Minnowhurn car park at Shaws Bridge. From the river, the trail rises aently through woodland, farmland and garden to the historic Giant's Ring. Evoking a powerful sense of mystery. this big earthwork circle, roughly 200m across, is a beautiful example of a 'henge' monument, built in about 2,700BC during the Neolithic period. Take a picnic and enjoy the carpets of bluebells and stunning views across the Lagan Valley before looping back to the carpark.

Divis and Black Mountain

Striking visual boundary of the city, the Belfast Hills provide a tranquil contrast to the hustle and bustle of urban life below. Just minutes from the city centre, the 4.2 mile Ridge Trail offers fantastic views over the famous landmarks of Belfast including Titanic Belfast, the Samson & Goliath cranes and Stormont Parliament Buildings, Cast your eves a little further afield to see the Moune Mountains. Strangford Lough, the Isle of Man and Scotland.

Belfast Castle & Cave Hill Country Park

Belfast Castle's spectacular location and imposing architecture boasts hours of family fun. Choose from the 2.4 mile Belfast Castle Estate trail, or be more adventurous and gain some of the best sights of Belfast on the 4.5 mile Cave Hill Country Park trail. The landmark Napoleon's Nose is said to have inspired Jonathan Swift's novel, Gulliver's Travels, Make a stop at the Cave Hill Visitor Centre, located in the basement of the Castle.

Barnett Demesne

For those looking for a little bit more adventure, try the bike trails and jump parks at Barnett Demesne. The trails consist of a shared use 3.4km green trail and a 3.9km blue trail with 3 red loop options (1.5km). With Ireland's first official purpose-built jumps park boasting no less than 6 lines of mouth-watering table-tops, doubles and hip jumps, these trails tick all the right boxes for those searching for that all important adrenaline fix! The trails start at the Mary Peters Track in South Belfast.

Comber Greenway

The Comber Greenway provides 7 miles of traffic-free cycling from Comber to Belfast. Along the route you'll pass



Connswater Community Greenway

The Connswater Community Greenway has created a 9km linear park through east Belfast, connecting the open and green spaces. 

TERRY BRADLEY

Terry Bradley is probably one of the most recognisable and collectable artists working in Ireland today as he continues to push his own boundaries and develop all sides of his creative vision.

His early life was spent growing up in some of the most volatile streets in Belfast where his mother tried to keep him inside and away from the "Troubles" outside their front door. Bradley found a form of escapism reading 'The Adventures of Tin Tin' and his work is still influenced by the black lines of the vivid drawings that illustrated the collection of books that he gradually acquired.

Bradley moved to Dublin in 1989 and was busy painting and drawing in his spare time. A chance conversation led

to Bradley's first exhibition in the famous PoD nightclub, which was a huge success and enabled him to make a career from his art, the one thing that had stayed with him all his life.

His recent work includes strong and powerful women, including Parisian burlesque dancers, and the colourful characters of Belfast's Sailortown, whose hardworking, hard-drinking ethos is renowned the world over, as well as world leading brand collaborations with Harley Davidson, ABSOLUT Vodka and Nokia mobile phones.





Terry's work has been a mainstay of the Irish art scene for many years now and collectors have seen the value of his art increase steadily over the years. Just over a vear ago, he created a Bradley dedicated gallery in the busy seaside town of Bangor in County Down, which has become a destination space for visitors to Northern Ireland as well as art collectors throughout Ireland. The large gallery space is both bright and cosy with interesting corners and relaxing seating areas. On show are a wide selection of Bradley limited edition prints, canvases and original art works.

Bradley is now moving into new areas with his art including an unusual turn using his work as body art. The artist started to notice that a growing number of collectors were using his pieces as tattoo designs and sending photos through of their completed pieces. This has led to thoughts for a new venture in the shape of bespoke tattoos being designed by the artist.

Terry says, 'I never thought of my art being used for tattoos but it seems to be quite a trend, it's very flattering that someone would want my art permanently on their body and it's a very individual choice but I'm actually very excited about the creative possibilities, not that I'll be doing any tattooing myself!!'.

At the moment Terry is concentrating on new work for both the gallery and exhibitions he has planned for 2019. He has been spending time in his studio in County Down between travelling for inspiration. He also has plans to return to New York where he launched the Dead Rabbit original for the world famous bar of the same name. Bradley says he feels he is just starting and with the launch of the new gallery he has a solid base to build on.

Make your way directly across the road to visit the **Linen Hall Library** (1788) where you can browse the unique collections of some of the most renowned Irish literature collections. **Linenhall.com**



1:00pm

Enjoy a light lunch in one of the many city centre cafes or restaurants before exploring the exquisite stores in the charming and historic Queen's Arcade, which connects Donegall Place with Fountain Street.



2:00pm

A 20 minute walk to the Queen's Quarter takes you to the stunning Lanyon Building (dating back to 1849), which is the centrepiece of

Queen's University.

Take a self-guided tour of the campus, available from the onsite Welcome Centre.

Discover Ulster Scots 1-9 Victoria Street

The Naughton Gallery Lanyon Building, Queen's University

One of Belfast's most vibrant and exciting art galleries, featuring a rolling

Atypical Gallery 109-113 Royal Avenue

Museum of Orange Heritage 368 Cregagh Road

Located in the EastSide, this museum offers a fantastic and interactive visitor experience learning about the Orange culture. TITANIC BELFAST

One of the world's leading tourist attractions is housed in an iconic six-floor building. With nine interpretive and interactive galleries that explore the sights, sounds, smells and stories of Titanic, as well as the City and people which made her, Titanic Belfast is an unmissable experience.

THE GREAT LIGHT

This former lighthouse optic is a unique heritage object with significance to Belfast's economic industrial maritime past. Originally serving both Mew and Tory Island lighthouses, the Great Light is a new feature on the Titanic Walkway linking the Titanic Slipways with HMS Caroline. The optic is the largest of its kind ever constructed and dates back to 1887. It is lit all year round and has amazing views over Belfast Harbour and Lough. * If the blinds are down it's to protect the Great Light from the sunlight. greatlighttq.org

TITANIC & OLYMPIC

Behind Titanic Belfast you'll find the historic slipways where these famous ships were built and launched over a hundred years ago. Containing many original features, a Memorial Garden illustrates the proportion of Titanic's victims and survivors from each of the passenger classes and crew. The outline of the sister ships illuminate at night and are the perfect space to reflect.

THE WEE TRAM¹

Take a tram ride through the past, present and future of Titanic Quarter on board the unique 'wee tram'. Hop on and off as often as you like, explore Titanic's birthplace and see the shipyard come to life.
