- Masters in Public Health (MPH)
- MSc Molecular Pathology of Cancer
- MSc Bioinformatics & Computational Genomics

The programme will provide an unrivalled opportunity to perform PhD study at an international Centre of Excellence for Cancer Research. It will expose students to different working cultures and acquisition of new skills sets that will elevate scientific outputs and enhance career potential.

A minimum 2.1 Honours degree (or equivalent qualification acceptable to the University) in a relevant biological subject is required. Evidence of equivalent professional qualifications as appropriate.
