

Clinical Psychologist


works in settings that involve mental health, the brain or behaviour

& so much more!













Skills acquired through studying psychology at undergraduate level

Clinical Psychology training



Doctorate in Clinical Psychology (DClinPsy) is the primary route to becoming a clinical psychologist.



The programme typically takes three years and combines academic learning with practical placements in various clinical settings.



Institutions like Trinity College Dublin, University College Dublin, and University College Cork offer accredited DClinPsy programmes in Rol.



Queens University Belfast delivers Clinical Psychology training for the HSC in N. Ireland




Clearing House system in UK for access to courses in England, Scotland and Wales.


