The School of Psychology at Queen's provides excellent training in Psychology and currently offers a variety of undergraduate, postgraduate taught and postgraduate research degrees.

In the 2021 National Student Survey we had an overall satisfaction of 81%. The most recent Research Excellence Framework (REF 2014) placed the School among the UK's top 20 Psychology, Psychiatry and Neuroscience departments in terms of both research intensity and research impact. Our impact reflects how the School's research is informing policy makers, developing industry partnerships and ultimately touching on the lives of thousands of individuals. We are at the forefront of ground-breaking research which you'll find embedded throughout our teaching.

As well as applying for direct entry students from HELP can apply for entry to year 2 of the psychology degree. This involves students undertaking their first year at HELP University and their second and third year at Queen's. Students will graduate with a Queen's University degree. Degree classification is based on the results from assessments taken whilst studying at Queen's only. **Successful completion of our undergraduate programme confers eligibility for the Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership (GBC) with the British Psychological Society (BPS).**

Modules

Year 2: You will take three compulsory modules covering topics such as cognitive psychology, developmental psychology, social psychology, individual differences, perception, psychobiology, research methods and statistics. You will be building a more detailed knowledge of the core domain of psychology whilst developing critical and analytical thinking skills. Our subject specialists use a mixture of theoretical and practical teaching methods to hone the skills required to be a successful graduate.

Year 3: You will be able to tailor your Psychology degree according to your own individual interests by choosing from a selection of modules designed to explore current developments across the domains of Psychology; all delivered by our cutting-edge researchers.

In addition, you will complete your degree in Psychology by submitting a research project thesis at the end of Year 3. This independent research is completed under the supervision of our expert academic staff, who will be with you every step of the way on your transition to becoming a graduate Psychologist.

Special Features

Placements:

Employability is embedded into our programme, being commended by the BPS and employers. We offer assessed work placements in final year or a full year paid professional placement with one of our graduate employment partners.

Research Experience Scheme: The Research Experience Scheme for Undergraduate Students (RESUS) provides an online framework within which psychology undergraduates can gain valuable experience working on research projects with members of staff in the School. This work might involve a range of activities including: designing stimuli, recruiting participants, running experiments, coding data. Students will gain a greater understanding of how research is performed, as well as developing key skills in the specific areas in which they work.

Scholarships (up to £5,500)

All international students beginning their first year of full-time undergraduate study in Queen's University Belfast in September 2022 who meet the conditions of their academic offer will receive an International Office Undergraduate Scholarship (£3000 for BSc Psychology degree). No application is necessary, terms and conditions apply.

Early Confirmation Award

A £1500 reduction is available to new international students beginning a full-time course in September 2022 who have both met the conditions of their offer and paid tuition fees in full by the stipulated deadline.

Entry Requirements

Pre-University – as required by HELP University.

Year 2 – Each student accepted onto Queen's BSc Psychology programme must have passed all Stage 1 modules and have obtained at least 3.0 CGPA in Stage 1 Bachelor of Psychology at HELP University.

Each student accepted onto QUEEN'S BSc Psychology programme must have achieved an IELTS score of 6.5 or above, with a minimum of 5.5 in all four elements of the test (or equivalent as defined by QUEEN'S), taken within the last two (2) years.

How to Apply

Most students make their applications through UCAS (Universities and Colleges Admissions Service) for full-time undergraduate degree programmes at Queen's.

Please note that the UCAS code name for Queen's is QBELF and the number is Q75.

The Direct Entry Application form is to be used by international applicants who wish to apply directly, and only, to Queen's.
