

MSc Psychological Science (Conversion) 1 year full-time or 2 years part-time

The Subject

Psychology is the scientific study of the mind and behaviour, so virtually anything related to the behaviour of humans and animals (normal or abnormal, social or personal, adult or child, subjective feelings or overt behaviour) is of interest to psychologists

Psychology is a science, with all our students taking modules in statistics and experimental design, as required by our accrediting body, the British Psychological Society (BPS).

Entrance Requirements

Applicants must normally possess or expect to possess by admission to the course, a 2.2 Honours degree and above, or equivalent recognised qualification.

Additional information for international students:

Applicants who are non-EEA nationals must satisfy the UK Border Agency immigration requirements for language for visa purposes, by providing evidence of an iELTS score of 6.5, with not less than 5.5 in any component, or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the University.

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The Course

Students complete five modules during the MSc programme including:

- Core Psychology I: Social, Individual Differences, Conceptual & Historical Issues, Perception
- Core Psychology II: Developmental, Cognition, Psychobiology and Applications of Psychology
- Applications of psychology in the 'real world'
- Methods, Design and Analysis in Psychology
- Research Thesis Psychology

Our students are assessed through coursework essays, exams, multiple choice questions, practical lab work, group work, presentations, literature review and an independent thesis report.

The MSc Psychological Studies (Conversion) is accredited as conferring eligibility for the Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership, provided the minimum standard is achieved.
