A Placement Programme has been running successfully within Queen's Management School for over 25 years. Preparation for placement begins in first year with an induction course educating students on the placement process. In second year students attend a number of workshops on a variety of topics including interview techniques, commercial awareness and presentation skills.

Students receive one on one support and guidance throughout their search for a placement and beyond. Students studying for a BSc are required to work for a minimum of nine months in a salaried position while MSc students can complete a twelve week project based internship in lieu of a traditional dissertation.

Undergraduate students have obtained placements with a variety of firms including: Citi, Spence & Partners, KPMG, Citco, EY, Goldman Sachs, First Derivatives, Randox, Invesco, Morgan Stanley, Kerr Henderson, FinTrU, Bank of England, Grant Thornton.

MARKETING **INTERNSHIP** AND WORK-BASED RESEARCH PROJECT

Students have the opportunity to apply for minimum 12-week paid internship as an alternative to the traditional MSc dissertation in Semester 3. It is compulsory for students who secure an internship to submit a work-based research project as the final element of the MSc Marketing degree. This option provides students with the opportunity to apply and review academic and theoretical principles in practice. It also provides students with real-world experience of working in a marketing environment.

Companies who have recruited students for internships previously include: Adoreboard, Fathom, Glowmetrics, Mash Direct, MCS Group.

The DegreePlus Award recognises and accredits Queen's students for the personal initiative and drive they demonstrate in developing skills and experiences outside of their academic programme.

Students who complete relevant experiences, led by an approved Activity Provider, will be eligible for the Award. Examples of activities include self-organised extracurricular work placements, management and leadership development programmes, language and IT courses, and volunteering.

Students who successfully complete Degree Plus will have the accreditation recorded on their QSIS record and will receive a certificate at their graduation ceremony.

WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?

Do you want to spend time working in another European country? Erasmus is the European Commission's exchange programme that enables students registered at a recognised university to study, work or teach for part of their degree in another European country. It aims to increase European awareness amongst university students by encouraging them to experience work or study in another European Union member state, or member states of the European Economic Area.

Since the UK has now left the EU, the continued availability of Erasmus funding is unclear. However, funding through the scheme may still be possible for students in Northern Ireland The UK has also launched the Turing scheme. Please contact the Global Opportunities team for the latest information.



DID YOU KNOW?

Each year, the Erasmus Programme provides funding for approximately 200 Queen's students to undertake a work placement in Europe. Erasmus grants are provided only for formally organised study or work placements involving specific universities or organisations with which Queen's has an agreement. The amount of Erasmus grant you receive depends on the length of time spent abroad and the country you go to. It is designed to help cover the extra cost-of-living of a placement abroad but not your full costs. A contribution towards travel is included in the amount you receive.

Would you like to spend up to a year studying in another European country as a recognised part of your Queen's degree?

Students undertaking study placements abroad as a recognised element of their degree are eligible to apply for the placement to be considered towards the Queen's Degree Plus award. The award provides official recognition by the University of the non-academic benefits of an exchange placement, such as improved employability skills, global and cultural awareness and increased self-confidence and motivation.

Generation UK-China was launched by the British Council in 2013. The programme aims to bring young people from the UK and China closer together, increase mutual understanding, and pave the way to lasting links and partnerships between the UK and China.

Internships: These two-month internships are set up through partnerships with CRCC Asia and InternChina, and cover a wide variety of sectors, including IT, legal, marketing, accounting, pharmaceuticals, hospitality and tourism. Which company you choose to go with depends largely on what city you want to work in.

EnlightKS offers diagnostic testing with feedback, to help you prepare for the tests. Test sessions are held during working hours; twice a month during semester and once a month during the summer months; in the McClay Library



WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?

The Northern Ireland Business and Human Rights Student Ambassador Programme is a collaborative initiative between Queen's Management School and the Northern Ireland Business and Human Rights Forum.

The purpose of the programme is to equip students with the knowledge and skills to act as ambassadors to promote ethics and human rights within business during both their academic studies and future professional careers. The Programme is open to students at any level from across Queen's University.

The programme is based upon three elements which must be fulfilled for the student to be put forward for DegreePlus accreditation and receive a certificate from OMS and the NIBHRF.

Peer Mentoring at Queen's offers you, as a new student, the opportunity to access guidance and advice from students who have already completed Level 1.

In level two, you can become a Peer Mentor. It's subject-based and mentors are selected by School staff and trained by the Learning Development Service. Subject-based undergraduate peer mentors are trained to support incoming first years with transition and, in some cases, provide a level of academic support through the facilitation of study groups.

All mentors are trained in one to one and group communication skills, facilitation skills, coaching skills and generic study skills support.



Students' contribution and engagement with the scheme is monitored by the School/discipline Academic Lead. Peer mentoring aims to make the transition to University smoother and less daunting.

The Elite Athlete and Academy Scholarship Programmes are designed to develop and nurture student athletes at Queen's. Currently there are five academies - Rugby, GAA, Soccer, Rowing and Hockey - with over 35 teams and 600 students competing each year. Add this to the thousands of students active in clubs and societies and sporting alumni worldwide creates a unique collegiate spirit and values base that embodies all that is good about Queen's.

Each academy has set sports specific criteria for students to meet with over 100 Academy Scholarship places available each year. There is a pathway developed that facilitates the Student Club into the Academy and then on to the Elite Athlete Programme.

Queen's University recognises that combining high level sport and higher education can be difficult. The University is fully supportive of elite athletes who manage themselves well and are proactive in organising their sport and their studies.
