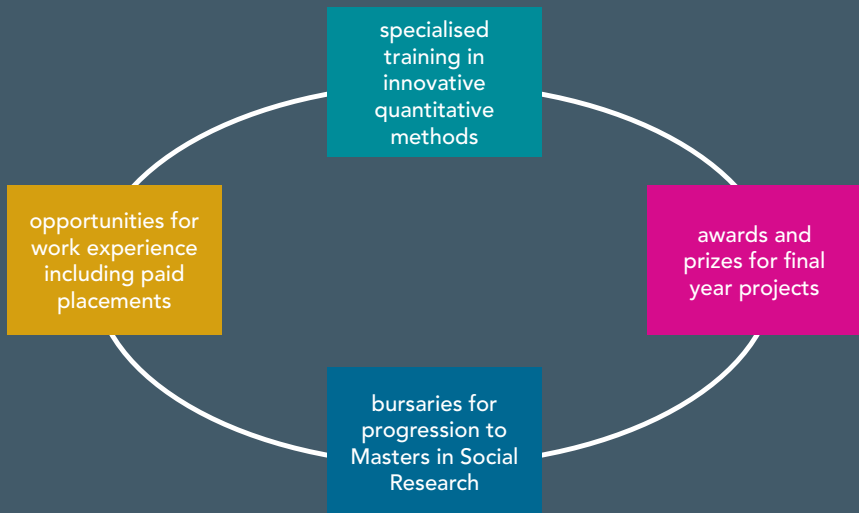




BSc Sociology with Quantitative Methods
