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The Jack Trial:

4 Key Messages for those building evidence for Comprehensive Sexuality Education

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The Jack trial focussed especially on maleengagement gendertransformative CSE

- We developed and tested
 If I Were Jack
 (https://www.ifiwerejack.com/)
- Girls and boys in the intervention arm had significantly increased support for gender-equitable masculinities

2. Provides robust evidence for CSE

Large RCT involving 8000+ adolescents aged 14-15 years in 64 schools in the UK

The trial demonstrated that CSE led to:

- Increased reliable contraceptive use once young people are sexually active (boys and girls)
- No increase in sexual initiation
- Increased sexual health knowledge and intentions to have safe consensual relationships (even up to one year later)

3. One of the first trials to test cost-effectiveness

The Jack Trial demonstrated that CSE is cost effective

The trial demonstrated that over a 20 year period the intervention would

- result in fewer unintended pregnancies and STIs
- result in a gain in quality-adjusted life years (QALYs)
- · with a delivery cost of £5 per pupil

4. Supports evidence of co-designed CSE

The Jack Trial supports evidence of co-designed CSE with young people

The If I Were Jack programme was

- co-designed with adolescents, teachers, parents and CSE policy makers, and
- delivered in faith-based as well as non-faith-based schools.
