The Institute's priority research theme for the 2013-14 academic year is:

Cross-currents in global humanities: communicating the challenge of cultural exchange beyond borders

The concept of global humanities has gained much currency in recent times. But what constitutes the global? How is the global mediated at a local level? How can we interpret the ideal of global humanities as an opportunity for greater international co-operation and cultural exchange that moves beyond a narrow economically-focussed understanding of the global? What value might we then place on the connections that can be forged through local-global interchange and cross fertilization in the Arts and Humanities? These are some of the challenging questions that Arts and Humanities scholars across the world are currently debating and they now provide the Institute for Collaborative Research in the Humanities at Queen's with the basis for its annual research theme in 2013-14.

The Institute welcomes applications from academic colleagues wishing to take up one of two fellowships available in the Institute during 2013-14. The closing date for applications is Friday 12 April 2013 at 4pm.
