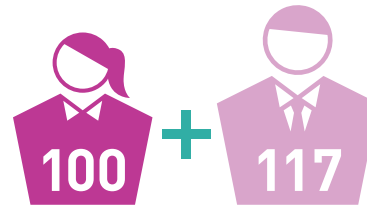

As well as providing 3,303 jobs itself in 2012-13, the spending of QUB and its students generated, respectively, another 3,859 and 3,088 jobs elsewhere in the UK economy (full-time equivalent (FTE)) – making a total of **10,250** jobs.

So for every 100 direct FTE jobs created in the university, the spending of QUB generated another **117** jobs in other parts of the UK economy – 89 of which are in Northern Ireland.

IMPACT ON THE ECONOMY

For every **£1m** of QUB output, a further impact of **£1.34m** is generated UK-wide – **£0.89m** of which is in Northern Ireland.

Adding together the university's annual output of £289m, the knock-on effects of this in other UK industries, and the output of its students' off-campus spending, QUB had a combined impact of **£988m** in 2012-13.

GVA is another way of measuring economic value. When combined with the impact of spending of international students and students from other parts of the UK, QUB generated total GVA of over **£460m** in 2012-13.
