The Northern Ireland Longitudinal Study (NILS) Ten Year Anniversary Linking Data, Informing Policy

The NILS is a large-scale, representative data-linkage study created by linking data from the NI Health Card Registration system to the 1981, 1991, 2001 and 2011 Census returns and to administrative data from other sources, e.g. births and deaths registered with the General Register Office for NI. Since its establishment in 2006, the NILS has supported high quality, policyrelevant research on health, population and society.

To mark the ten year anniversary of the NILS, a special event is being held at Queen's University Belfast to celebrate the diversity of research that has been undertaken over the decade, to outline the impact of this research and to set the NILS in the context of an evolving UK data landscape. Members of the diverse NILS user base and funders will be among the speakers on the day and a poster session will showcase the range of NILS research.
